| adore | Love and respect (someone) deeply. <i>She adores Mexican cuisine.</i> |
| affection | A positive feeling of liking. <i>An affection of the skin.</i> |
| beating | Pulsation or throbbing, especially of the heart. <i>Torture methods included beating.</i> |
| cherish | Be fond of; be attached to. <i>I cherish the letters she wrote.</i> |
| congratulatory | Conveying good wishes or praise to someone in response to an achievement or special occasion. <i>As well as a congratulatory message from the Queen Elsie received many cards and flowers.</i> |
| couple | A pair of partners in a dance or game. <i>We got some eggs would you like a couple.</i> |
| cuddly | Denoting a toy, especially a model of an animal, that is padded or spongy and covered in soft fabric. <i>She was short and cuddly.</i> |
| diagonal | Mathematics a set of entries in a square matrix running diagonally either from the upper left to lower right entry or running from the upper right to lower left entry. <i>A diagonal line across the page.</i> |
| embrace | Hold (someone) closely in one’s arms, especially as a sign of affection. <i>Aunt Sophie embraced her warmly.</i> |
| embracement | The act of clasping another person in the arms (as in greeting or affection). |
| encourage | Contribute to the progress or growth of. <i>Pupils are encouraged to be creative.</i> |
| espouse | Take in marriage. <i>A virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph.</i> |

| family | An association of people who share common beliefs or activities. <i>The family home.</i> |
| fondly | With affection or liking. <i>They fondly believed the cheers were for them.</i> |
| greeting | (usually plural) an acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting). <i>Mandy shouted a greeting.</i> |
| hit | Hit the intended target or goal. <i>He picked up the phone and hit several buttons.</i> |
| hug | Cherish or cling to (something such as a belief). <i>Left winger Stewart hugged the touchline.</i> |
| kiss | A light glancing touch. <i>A quick kiss on the cheek.</i> |
| kissing | Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs). |
| love | A personified figure of love often represented as Cupid. <i>I just love dancing.</i> |
| lovingly | With love or great care. <i>They smile lovingly at each other.</i> |
| married | Married people. <i>Married life.</i> |
| pat | Pat or squeeze fondly or playfully especially under the chin. <i>A pat reply.</i> |
| snugly | With comparative ease; comfortably. <i>He motored away to win snugly by three and a half lengths.</i> |
| soothe | Cause to feel better. <i>The medicine soothes the pain of the inflammation.</i> |
| tap | Walk with a tapping sound. <i>On most vices the metal jaws are drilled and tapped to accept screws.</i> |
| whisper | A soft or confidential tone of voice a whispered word or phrase. <i>Alison was whispering in his ear.</i> |
