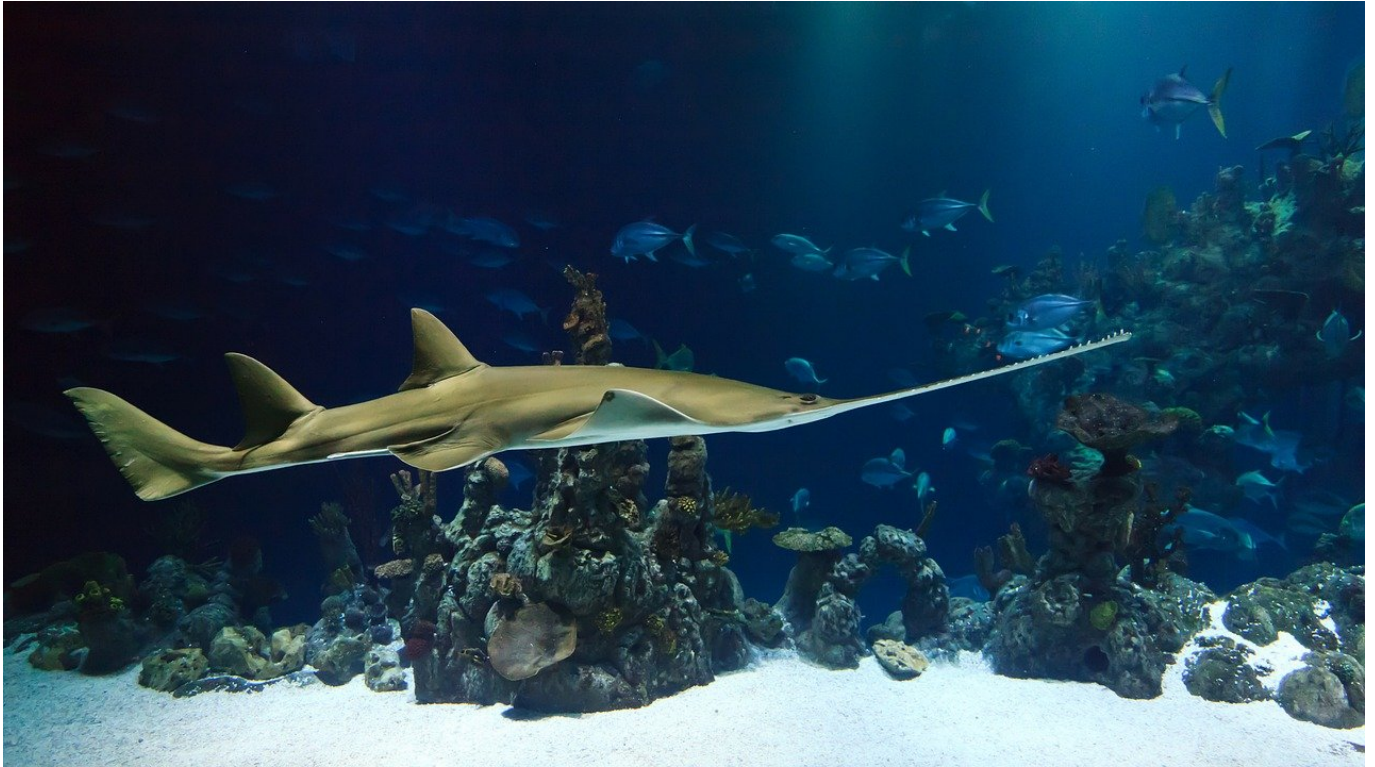

## **Carpenter as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Carpenter" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “carpenter” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person who makes and repairs wooden objects and structures.*
- *A woodworker who makes or repairs wooden objects.*



## Synonyms of "Carpenter" as a noun (3 Words)

**cabinetmaker** A woodworker who specializes in making furniture.

**joiner** A woodworker whose work involves making things by joining pieces of wood.

*Bricklayers and **joiners** are needed to convert derelict properties.*

**woodworker** Makes things out of wood.





## Associations of "Carpenter" (30 Words)

- apprentice**      Serve as an apprentice.  
An ***apprentice*** barman.
- architect**      Someone who creates plans to be used in making something (such as buildings).  
Few software packages were ***architected*** with Ethernet access in mind.
- architectural**      Relating to or constituting buildings.  
An ***architectural*** firm.
- assembler**      A program for converting instructions written in low-level symbolic code into machine code.

<b>blacksmith</b>	A farrier.
<b>bricklayer</b>	A craftsman skilled in building with bricks.
<b>builder</b>	A person whose job is to construct or repair houses. <i>Breaking the record was a real confidence <b>builder</b>.</i>
<b>carpentry</b>	The work made or done by a carpenter. <b>Carpentry</b> skills.
<b>craftsman</b>	A professional whose work is consistently of high quality. <i>As an actor he was a consummate <b>craftsman</b>.</i>
<b>electrician</b>	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
<b>engineer</b>	A person qualified in a branch of engineering especially as a professional. <i>She <b>engineered</b> another meeting with him.</i>
<b>engraver</b>	A tool or machine used to cut or carve text or designs on the surface of hard objects. <i>The <b>engraver</b> etches the design into a high quality steel plate.</i>
<b>expert</b>	A person who is very knowledgeable about or skilful in a particular area. <i>A financial <b>expert</b>.</i>
<b>forest</b>	Denoting an area that was formerly a royal forest. <i>A pine <b>forest</b>.</i>
<b>glazier</b>	A person whose trade is fitting glass into windows and doors.
<b>linesman</b>	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
<b>machinist</b>	A person who makes machinery.
<b>mason</b>	A Freemason. <i>One course of massive stones roughly <b>masoned</b>.</i>
<b>master</b>	Someone who holds a master s degree from academic institution. <i>All records are now being <b>mastered</b> and manufactured for us in the Netherlands.</i>
<b>mechanic</b>	A skilled worker who repairs and maintains vehicle engines and other machinery. <i>A car <b>mechanic</b>.</i>
<b>operator</b>	A person who acts in a shrewd or manipulative way. <i>Her reputation as a cool clever <b>operator</b>.</i>
<b>plumber</b>	A person who fits and repairs the pipes, fittings, and other apparatus of water supply, sanitation, or heating systems.
<b>repairman</b>	A person who repairs vehicles, machinery, or appliances. <i>A TV <b>repairman</b>.</i>
<b>sculptor</b>	A faint constellation in the southern hemisphere near Phoenix and Cetus.



<b>silversmith</b>	A person who makes silver articles.
<b>smith</b>	Religious leader who founded the Mormon Church in 1830 (1805-1844). <i>Tin bronze was cast into ingots before being <b>smithed</b> into bracelets.</i>
<b>tanner</b>	A craftsman who tans skins and hides. <i>Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless <b>tanners</b>.</i>
<b>technician</b>	Someone whose occupation involves training in a specific technical process. <i>Liszt was one of the greatest piano <b>technicians</b> of all time.</i>
<b>welder</b>	A person who welds metal. <i>He worked as a <b>welder</b> in a steel factory.</i>
<b>wright</b>	Influential United States architect (1869-1959).
