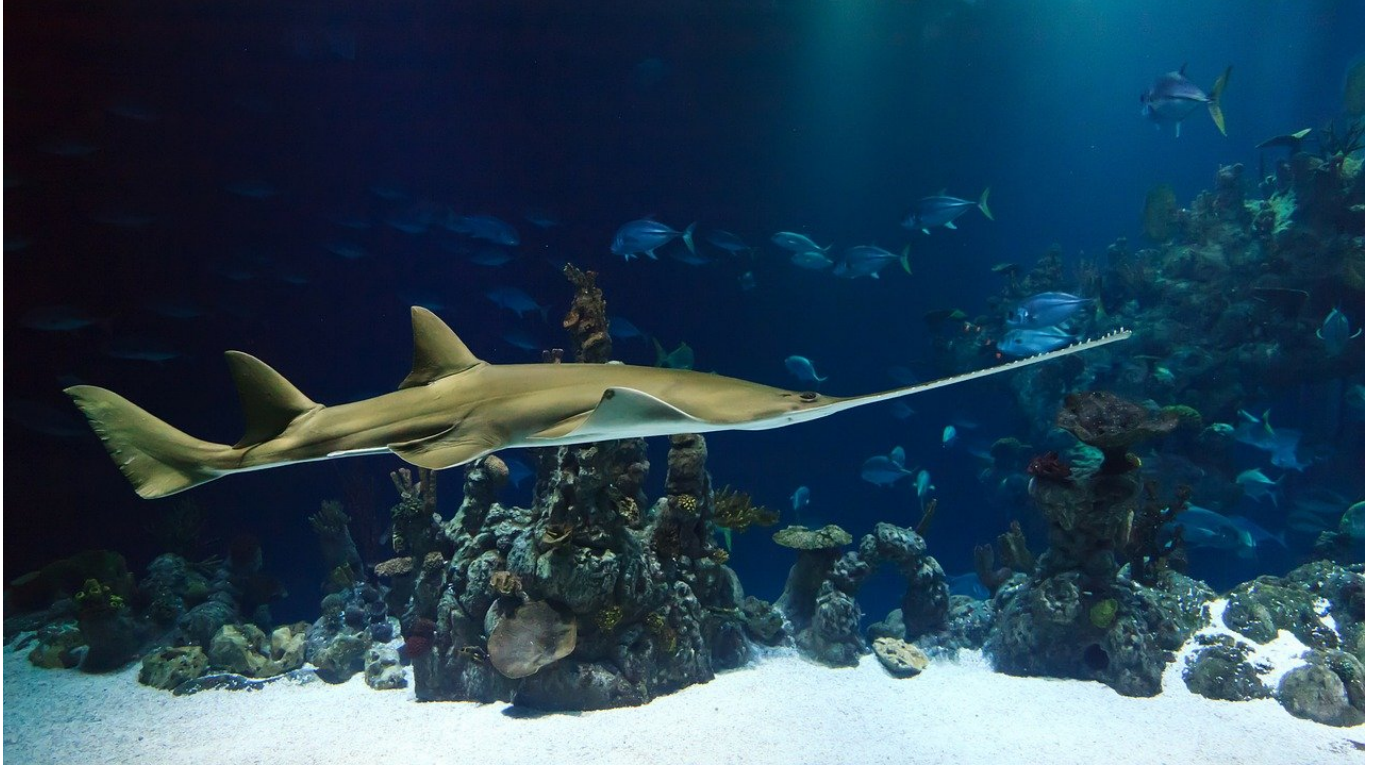

Definitions of "Carpenter" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “carpenter” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person who makes and repairs wooden objects and structures.*
- *A woodworker who makes or repairs wooden objects.*



Synonyms of "Carpenter" as a noun (3 Words)

cabinetmaker A woodworker who specializes in making furniture.

joiner A woodworker whose work involves making things by joining pieces of wood.

*Bricklayers and **joiners** are needed to convert derelict properties.*

woodworker Makes things out of wood.



Associations of "Carpenter" (30 Words)

- apprentice** Serve as an apprentice.
An **apprentice** barman.
- architect** Someone who creates plans to be used in making something (such as buildings).
Few software packages were **architected** with Ethernet access in mind.
- architectural** Relating to or constituting buildings.
An **architectural** firm.
- assembler** A program for converting instructions written in low-level symbolic code into machine code.

blacksmith	A farrier.
bricklayer	A craftsman skilled in building with bricks.
builder	A person whose job is to construct or repair houses. <i>Breaking the record was a real confidence builder.</i>
carpentry	The work made or done by a carpenter. Carpentry skills.
craftsman	A professional whose work is consistently of high quality. <i>As an actor he was a consummate craftsman.</i>
electrician	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
engineer	A person qualified in a branch of engineering especially as a professional. <i>She engineered another meeting with him.</i>
engraver	A tool or machine used to cut or carve text or designs on the surface of hard objects. <i>The engraver etches the design into a high quality steel plate.</i>
expert	A person who is very knowledgeable about or skilful in a particular area. <i>A financial expert.</i>
forest	Denoting an area that was formerly a royal forest. <i>A pine forest.</i>
glazier	A person whose trade is fitting glass into windows and doors.
linesman	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
machinist	A person who makes machinery.
mason	A Freemason. <i>One course of massive stones roughly masoned.</i>
master	Someone who holds a master s degree from academic institution. <i>All records are now being mastered and manufactured for us in the Netherlands.</i>
mechanic	A skilled worker who repairs and maintains vehicle engines and other machinery. <i>A car mechanic.</i>
operator	A person who acts in a shrewd or manipulative way. <i>Her reputation as a cool clever operator.</i>
plumber	A person who fits and repairs the pipes, fittings, and other apparatus of water supply, sanitation, or heating systems.
repairman	A person who repairs vehicles, machinery, or appliances. <i>A TV repairman.</i>
sculptor	A faint constellation in the southern hemisphere near Phoenix and Cetus.

- silversmith** A person who makes silver articles.
- smith** Religious leader who founded the Mormon Church in 1830 (1805-1844).
*Tin bronze was cast into ingots before being **smithed** into bracelets.*
- tanner** A craftsman who tans skins and hides.
*Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless **tanners**.*
- technician** Someone whose occupation involves training in a specific technical process.
*Liszt was one of the greatest piano **technicians** of all time.*
- welder** A person who welds metal.
*He worked as a **welder** in a steel factory.*
- wright** Influential United States architect (1869-1959).
