Associations of "Carried out" (30 Words)

<u>abroad</u>	In different directions; over a wide area. <i>Few people ventured abroad from their warm houses.</i>
addressee	The person to whom something is addressed. <i>The need to state clearly the addressees of reports.</i>
comport	Accord or agree with. <i>They do all that nature and art can do to comport with his will.</i>
<u>concomitant</u>	A phenomenon that naturally accompanies or follows something. <i>She loved travel with all its concomitant worries.</i>
<u>consist</u>	Be consistent with. <i>To turn an entire consist requires a wye.</i>
contain	Include or contain have as a component. <i>This can contains water.</i>
<u>convey</u>	Transfer the title to (property). <i>Mr Harvey and his daughter have asked me to convey their very kind regards.</i>
conveyance	The action or process of transporting or carrying someone or something from one place to another. <i>A role that demands much more than the conveyance of simple emotions.</i>
<u>entail</u>	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>Her father s estate was entailed on a cousin.</i>
entangle	Involve (someone) in difficulties or complicated circumstances from which it is difficult to escape. <i>The child entangled the cord.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>
exclude	Lack or fail to include. <i>One cannot exclude the possibility of a fall in house prices.</i>

<u>exhale</u>	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>The chimney exhales a thick smoke.</i>
ferry	Travel by ferry. <i>Ambulances ferried the injured to hospital.</i>
ferryboat	A boat that transports people or vehicles across a body of water and operates on a regular schedule.
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>The dog fetched the hat.</i>
<u>implicate</u>	Convey (a meaning) indirectly through what one says, rather than stating it explicitly. <i>By saying that coffee would keep her awake Mary implicated that she didn't want any.</i>
include	Allow participation in or the right to be part of; permit to exercise the rights, functions, and responsibilities of. <i>I include you in the list of culprits.</i>
included	Contained as part of a whole being considered. <i>Service tax included.</i>
<u>involve</u>	Occupy or engage the interest of. <i>Don't involve me in your family affairs.</i>
mail	Email. <i>I'll mail you the paper when it's written.</i>
mailing	The transmission of a letter. <i>The postmark indicates the time of mailing.</i>
outrigger	A projecting support similar to an outrigger in another structure or vehicle.
<u>redefine</u>	Give a new or different definition to. <i>She redefined his duties.</i>
remove	Remove from a position or an office. <i>An explanation that is far removed from the truth.</i>
send	Send a message or letter. <i>Send me your latest results.</i>
stockpile	A storage pile accumulated for future use. <i>A stockpile of nuclear weapons.</i>
transfer	Transfer somebody to a different position or location of work. <i>He transferred to the Brooklyn Dodgers.</i>
<u>transmit</u>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>Knowledge is transmitted from teacher to pupil.</i>
