| <b>contain</b>     | Include or contain have as a component.<br><i>This can <b>contains</b> water.</i>  |
| <b>convey</b>      | Transfer the title to (property).<br><i>Mr Harvey and his daughter have asked me to <b>convey</b> their very kind regards.</i>   |
| <b>conveyance</b>  | The action or process of transporting or carrying someone or something from one place to another.<br><i>A role that demands much more than the <b>conveyance</b> of simple emotions.</i> |
| <b>entail</b>      | A property bequeathed under an entail.<br><i>Her father s estate was <b>entailed</b> on a cousin.</i>  |
| <b>entangle</b>    | Involve (someone) in difficulties or complicated circumstances from which it is difficult to escape.<br><i>The child <b>entangled</b> the cord.</i>                                      |
| <b>except</b>      | Take exception to.<br><i>Five classes of advertisement are <b>excepted</b> from control.</i>   |
| <b>exclude</b>     | Lack or fail to include.<br><i>One cannot <b>exclude</b> the possibility of a fall in house prices.</i>  |

| <b>exhale</b>    | Give out (breath or an odor).<br><i>The chimney <b>exhales</b> a thick smoke.</i>   |
| <b>ferry</b>     | Travel by ferry.<br><i>Ambulances <b>ferryed</b> the injured to hospital.</i>   |
| <b>ferryboat</b> | A boat that transports people or vehicles across a body of water and operates on a regular schedule.  |
| <b>fetch</b>     | The action of fetching.<br><i>The dog <b>fetches</b> the hat.</i>   |

| <b>include</b>   | Allow participation in or the right to be part of; permit to exercise the rights, functions, and responsibilities of.<br><i>I <b>include</b> you in the list of culprits.</i>                 |
| <b>included</b>  | Contained as part of a whole being considered.<br><i>Service tax <b>included</b>.</i>   |
| <b>involve</b>   | Occupy or engage the interest of.<br><i>Don't <b>involve</b> me in your family affairs.</i>   |
| <b>mail</b>      | Email.<br><i>I'll <b>mail</b> you the paper when it's written.</i>  |
| <b>mailing</b>   | The transmission of a letter.<br><i>The postmark indicates the time of <b>mailing</b>.</i>  |
| <b>outrigger</b> | A projecting support similar to an outrigger in another structure or vehicle.   |
| <b>redefine</b>  | Give a new or different definition to.<br><i>She <b>redefined</b> his duties.</i>   |
| <b>remove</b>    | Remove from a position or an office.<br><i>An explanation that is far <b>removed</b> from the truth.</i>  |
| <b>send</b>      | Send a message or letter.<br><i><b>Send</b> me your latest results.</i>   |
| <b>stockpile</b> | A storage pile accumulated for future use.<br><i>A <b>stockpile</b> of nuclear weapons.</i>   |
