### Definitions of "Carrier" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “carrier” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person or firm in the business of transporting people or goods or messages.*
- *An inactive substance that is a vehicle for a radioactive tracer of the same substance and that assists in its recovery after some chemical reaction.*
- *A substance used to support or convey another substance such as a pigment, catalyst, or radioactive material.*
- *(genetics) an organism that possesses a recessive gene whose effect is masked by a dominant allele; the associated trait is not apparent but can be passed on to offspring.*
- *Someone whose employment involves carrying something.*
- *A boy who delivers newspapers.*
- *A large warship that carries planes and has a long flat deck for takeoffs and landings.*
- *A self-propelled wheeled vehicle designed specifically to carry something.*
- *An aircraft carrier.*
- *An individual that possesses a particular gene, especially as a single copy whose effect is masked by a dominant allele, so that the associated characteristic (such as a hereditary disease) is not displayed but may be passed to offspring.*

- *A rack attached to a vehicle; for carrying luggage or skis or the like.*
- *A vessel or vehicle for transporting goods in bulk.*
- *A person or animal that transmits a disease-causing organism to others, especially without suffering from it themselves.*
- *A person (or animal) who has some pathogen to which he is immune but who can pass it on to others.*
- *A person or thing that carries, holds, or conveys something.*
- *A molecule that transfers a specified molecule or ion within the body, especially across a cell membrane.*
- *A carrier bag.*
- *(medicine) a person (or animal) who has some pathogen to which he is immune but who can pass it on to others.*
- *An organism that possesses a recessive gene whose effect is masked by a dominant allele; the associated trait is not apparent but can be passed on to offspring.*
- *A company that provides facilities for conveying telecommunications messages.*
- *A man who delivers the mail.*
- *A person or company that undertakes the professional conveyance of goods or people.*
- *A radio wave that can be modulated in order to transmit a signal.*



## Synonyms of "Carrier" as a noun (17 Words)

<b>aircraft carrier</b>	A vehicle that can fly.
<b>attack aircraft carrier</b>	An offensive move in a sport or game.
<b>bearer</b>	Payable to the possessor. <i>Promissory notes payable to the <b>bearer</b>.</i>
<b>carrier wave</b>	An organism that possesses a recessive gene whose effect is masked by a dominant allele; the associated trait is not apparent but can be passed on to offspring.
<b>common carrier</b>	A piece of open land for recreational use in an urban area.
<b><u>container</u></b>	An object for holding or transporting something. <i>The cakes will keep for up to two weeks if kept in an airtight <b>container</b>.</i>
<b>conveyor</b>	A conveyor belt. A <b>conveyor</b> of information.

<b>flattop</b>	A closely cropped haircut; usually for men.
<b>immune carrier</b>	A person who is immune to a particular infection.
<b>letter carrier</b>	Owner who lets another person use something (housing usually) for hire.
<b>mail carrier</b>	A conveyance that transports the letters and packages that are conveyed by the postal system.
<b>mailman</b>	A person who is employed to deliver and collect letters and parcels; a postman.
<b>newsboy</b>	A boy who sells or delivers newspapers.
<b>postman</b>	A person who is employed to deliver or collect letters and parcels.
<b>receptacle</b>	A container that is used to put or keep things in. <i>Fast food <b>receptacles</b>.</i>
<b>toter</b>	Someone whose employment involves carrying something. <i>A gun <b>toter</b>.</i>
<b>transporter</b>	A moving belt that transports objects (as in a factory).

<b>aviation</b>	The operation of aircraft to provide transportation. <i>Two events launched the history of modern <b>aviation</b>.</i>
<b>ballooning</b>	The sport or pastime of flying in a balloon. <i>He took up <b>ballooning</b> in 1907.</i>
<b>biomedical</b>	Relating to the activities and applications of science to clinical medicine.
<b>cargo</b>	Goods carried by a large vehicle. <i>Transportation of bulk <b>cargo</b>.</i>
<b>crew</b>	Serve as a crew member on. <i>A graffiti <b>crew</b> called the Syndicate.</i>
<b>disembarkation</b>	The act of passengers and crew getting off of a ship or aircraft.
<b>engine</b>	A wheeled vehicle consisting of a self propelled engine that is used to draw trains along railway tracks. <i>Exports used to be the <b>engine</b> of growth.</i>
<b>equipage</b>	A carriage and horses with attendants.
<b>fighter</b>	A high-speed military or naval airplane designed to destroy enemy aircraft in the air. <i>The distinction between civilian populations and <b>fighters</b>.</i>
<b>flight</b>	Shoot a bird in flight. <i>An eagle in <b>flight</b>.</i>
<b>flotilla</b>	A United States Navy fleet consisting of two or more squadrons of small warships. <i>A <b>flotilla</b> of cargo boats.</i>
<b>hangar</b>	House an aircraft in a hangar. <i>The army choppers that were <b>hangared</b> out at Springs.</i>
<b>helicopter</b>	Fly somewhere in a helicopter. <i>He was <b>helicoptered</b> out with a bleeding ulcer.</i>
<b>jet</b>	Issue in a jet come out in a jet stream or spring forth. <i>A private <b>jet</b>.</i>
<b>lander</b>	A space vehicle that is designed to land on the moon or another planet. <i>A lunar <b>lander</b>.</i>
<b>mailman</b>	A man who delivers the mail.
<b>maneuverable</b>	Capable of maneuvering or changing position. <i>A highly <b>maneuverable</b> ship.</i>
<b>mobile</b>	Relating to mobile phones handheld computers and similar technology. <i>Upwardly <b>mobile</b>.</i>
<b>newsboy</b>	A boy who delivers newspapers.

<b><u>package</u></b>	A package holiday. <i>The singer is being <b>packaged</b> to appeal to teenagers.</i>
<b>porter</b>	Carry luggage or supplies. <i>A nice pint of <b>porter</b>.</i>
<b>propeller</b>	A mechanical device that rotates to push against air or water.
<b>refuel</b>	Take on more fuel, as of a plane, ship, or car. <i>The chopper went to <b>refuel</b>.</i>
<b><u>ship</u></b>	Travel by ship. <i>Spare parts were quickly <b>shipped</b> out.</i>
<b>spacecraft</b>	A vehicle used for travelling in space.
<b>wing</b>	Shoot a bird in the wing so as to prevent flight without causing death. <i>In Britain they call a fender a <b>wing</b>.</i>
