express	Give expression to. <i>She expressed her anger.</i>
extend	Continue or extend. <i>Her generosity did not extend to all adults.</i>
gestate	Develop over a long period. <i>Rabbits gestate for approximately twenty eight days.</i>
have a bun in the oven	Get something; come into possession of.
hold	Support or hold in a certain manner. <i>She can hold an audience spellbound.</i>
impart	Bestow a quality on. <i>Shiitake mushrooms impart a wonderfully woody flavour to the salad.</i>
pack	Load with a pack. <i>You had better pack your swollen ankle with ice.</i>

persuade	Cause (someone) to believe something, especially after a sustained effort; convince. <i>It wasn't easy but I persuaded him to do the right thing.</i>
post	Publicize with or as if with a poster. <i>A curt notice had been posted on the door.</i>
run	Run as a sport or for exercise. <i>Run a new program on the Mac.</i>
<u>stock</u>	Supply with livestock. <i>I must stock up the fridge.</i>
stockpile	Have on hand. <i>He claimed that the weapons were being stockpiled.</i>
<u>sway</u>	Move or walk in a swinging or swaying manner. <i>Wind rattled and swayed the trees.</i>
take	Of a plant or seed take root or begin to grow germinate. <i>An exclusive island hideaway that takes just twenty guests.</i>
<u>transmit</u>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>The programme was transmitted on 7 October.</i>
transport	Transport commercially. <i>He was convicted of theft and transported.</i>

hold	Lessen the intensity of temper hold in restraint hold or keep within limits. <i>He can hold his liquor.</i>
implicate	A thing implied. <i>He is implicated in the scheme to defraud the government.</i>
include	Consider as part of something. <i>I include you in the list of culprits.</i>

included	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>Service tax included.</i>
inclusion	Any small intracellular body found within another (characteristic of certain diseases). <i>They have been selected for inclusion in the scheme.</i>
involve	Require as useful, just, or proper. <i>My job involves a lot of travelling.</i>
mail	A single delivery or collection of mail. <i>The mail handles billions of items every day.</i>
parcel	Make something into a parcel by wrapping it. <i>The farmers argue that parcelling out commercial farmland in small plots will reduce productivity.</i>
participate	Have or possess (a particular quality). <i>Thousands participated in a nationwide strike.</i>
pertain	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>The shop premises and stock and all assets pertaining to the business.</i>
send	Send a message or letter. <i>It s the spectacle and music that send us not the words.</i>
stockpile	Have on hand. <i>He claimed that the weapons were being stockpiled.</i>
synchronous	Occurring or existing at the same time or having the same period or phase. <i>Synchronous oscillations.</i>
transfer	Someone who transfers or is transferred from one position to another. <i>She transferred to the Physics Department.</i>
