<b>bag</b>	Put into a bag. <i>His <b>bag</b> now is learning to play golf.</i>
<b>carriage</b>	A small vehicle with four wheels in which a baby or child is pushed around. <i>The <b>carriage</b> of bikes on public transport.</i>
<b>comport</b>	Behave in a certain manner. <i>They do all that nature and art can do to <b>comport</b> with his will.</i>
<b>concomitant</b>	A phenomenon that naturally accompanies or follows something. <i>She loved travel with all its <b>concomitant</b> worries.</i>
<b>contain</b>	Be capable of holding or containing. <i>This can <b>contains</b> water.</i>
<b>convey</b>	Transfer the title to (property). <i>It s impossible to <b>convey</b> how lost I felt.</i>
<b>conveyance</b>	The action of making an idea, feeling, or impression known or understandable to someone. <i>Adventurers attempt the trail using all manner of <b>conveyances</b> including mountain bikes and motorcycles.</i>
<b>correlate</b>	Either of two or more related or complementary variables. <i>We should <b>correlate</b> general trends in public opinion with trends in the content of television news.</i>
<b>entail</b>	The act of entailing property the creation of a fee tail from a fee simple. <i>The damage being done in England by <b>entails</b>.</i>
<b>entangle</b>	Cause to become twisted together with or caught in. <i>Fish attempt to swim through the mesh and become <b>entangled</b>.</i>
<b>ferry</b>	Travel by ferry. <i>Ambulances <b>ferried</b> the injured to hospital.</i>
<b>ferryboat</b>	A boat that transports people or vehicles across a body of water and operates on a regular schedule.

<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>She <b>fetch</b>ed me a cup of tea.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have sex with. <i><b>Have</b> a lover.</i>
<b>hold</b>	To close within bounds limit or hold back from movement. <i>I <b>hold</b> to these ideas.</i>
<b><u>implicate</u></b>	Convey (a meaning) indirectly through what one says, rather than stating it explicitly. <i>He is <b>implicated</b> in the scheme to defraud the government.</i>
<b>include</b>	Specifically exclude someone from a group or activity. <i>We must <b>include</b> this chemical element in the group.</i>
<b>included</b>	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>Service tax <b>included</b>.</i>
<b>inclusion</b>	A body or particle of distinct composition embedded in a rock or other material. <i>He admired the <b>inclusion</b> of so many ideas in such a short work.</i>
<b><u>involve</u></b>	Connect closely and often incriminatingly. <i>His story completely <b>involved</b> me during the entire afternoon.</i>
<b>mail</b>	A vehicle such as a train carrying mail. <i>Three editions were <b>mailed</b> to our members.</i>
<b><u>parcel</u></b>	Make something into a parcel by wrapping it. <i>The lorry was carrying a large number of Royal Mail <b>parcels</b>.</i>
<b>participate</b>	Become a participant; be involved in. <i>Thousands <b>participated</b> in a nationwide strike.</i>
<b><u>pertain</u></b>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>Matters <b>pertaining</b> to the organization of government.</i>
<b>send</b>	Send a message or letter. <i>It s the spectacle and music that <b>send</b> us not the words.</i>
<b>stockpile</b>	Something kept back or saved for future use or a special purpose. <i>He claimed that the weapons were being <b>stockpiled</b>.</i>
<b>synchronous</b>	Pertaining to a transmission technique that requires a common clock signal (a timing reference) between the communicating devices in order to coordinate their transmissions. <i><b>Synchronous</b> oscillations.</i>
<b>transfer</b>	Someone who transfers or is transferred from one position to another. <i>Employees have been <b>transferred</b> to the installation team.</i>

**transmit**

Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission.

*Transmit a message.*

**transport**

Something that serves as a means of transportation.

*The bulk of freight traffic was **transported** by lorry.*
