
## **Cartoon as a Noun**

#### Definitions of "Cartoon" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "cartoon" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A simplified or exaggerated version or interpretation of something.
- A film using animation techniques to photograph a sequence of drawings rather than real people or objects.
- A full-size drawing made by an artist as a preliminary design for a painting or other work of art.
- A narrative sequence of humorous drawings in a comic, magazine, or newspaper, usually with captions.
- A film made by photographing a series of cartoon drawings to give the illusion of movement when projected in rapid sequence.
- A simple drawing showing the features of its subjects in a humorously exaggerated way, especially a satirical one in a newspaper or magazine.
- A humorous or satirical drawing published in a newspaper or magazine.







## Synonyms of "Cartoon" as a noun (18 Words)

delineation	The action of indicating the exact position of a border or boundary. The artist s exquisite <b>delineation</b> of costume and jewellery.
graphic novel	An image that is generated by a computer.
lampoon	A speech or text lampooning someone or something. <i>The magazine fired at God Royalty and politicians using cartoons and</i> <i>lampoons.</i>
outline	A line or set of lines enclosing or indicating the shape of an object in a sketch or diagram. The <b>outline</b> s of dockside warehouses standing sharp on the skyline.
<u>parody</u>	An imitation of the style of a particular writer, artist, or genre with deliberate exaggeration for comic effect. <i>His provocative use of parody</i> .
preliminary drawing	Something that serves as a preceding event or introduces what follows.
rough	The part of a golf course bordering the fairway where the grass is not cut short. His second shot lay in the <b>rough</b> .
<u>satire</u>	A genre of literature characterized by the use of satire. A stinging <b>satire</b> on American politics.
<u>sketch</u>	A short humorous play or performance, consisting typically of one scene in a revue or comedy programme. A hilarious <b>sketch</b> for their latest BBC series.
toon	A cartoon film. <i>He drags the <b>toon</b> s mouth into a droop.</i>
