According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "carve" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Engrave or cut by chipping away at a surface.
- Cut (a hard material) in order to produce an object, design, or inscription.
- Cut (cooked meat) into slices for eating.
- Cut to pieces.
- Form by carving.
- Make (a turn) by tilting one's skis on to their edges and using one's weight to bend them so that they slide in an arc.
- Produce (an object, inscription, or design) by cutting into a hard material.
- Establish (a career, role, or reputation) for oneself through hard work.
- Cut (a slice of meat) from a larger piece.
