Definitions of "Carving" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "carving" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- The action of carving.
- Creating figures or designs in three dimensions.
- An object or design carved from a hard material as an artistic work.
- Removing parts from hard material to create a desired pattern or shape.
- A sculpture created by removing material (as wood or ivory or stone) in order to create a desired shape.

figurine A small carved or molded figure.

model The act of representing something (usually on a smaller scale.

He was a **model** husband and father.


A work of art made by sculpture.

<u>statue</u> A sculpture representing a human or animal.

statuette A small carved or molded figure.
