academic	Not of practical relevance; of only theoretical interest. <i>The debate has been largely academic.</i>
academician	Someone elected to honorary membership in an academy.
<u>disciple</u>	A personal follower of Christ during his life, especially one of the twelve Apostles. <i>A disciple of Rousseau.</i>
economist	An expert in the science of economics.
educated	Having been educated. <i>A Harvard educated lawyer.</i>
<u>erudite</u>	Having or showing great knowledge or learning. <i>An erudite professor.</i>
geometer	A person skilled in geometry.
<u>historian</u>	An expert in or student of history, especially that of a particular period, geographical region, or social phenomenon. <i>A military historian.</i>
<u>intellectual</u>	A person who uses the mind creatively. <i>Children need intellectual stimulation.</i>
knowledge	Facts, information, and skills acquired through experience or education; the theoretical or practical understanding of a subject. <i>Her considerable knowledge of antiques.</i>
literati	The literary intelligentsia.
logician	A person skilled at symbolic logic. <i>A leading mathematical logician.</i>
mathematician	A person skilled in mathematics. <i>One of the world's foremost theoretical mathematicians.</i>
metallurgical	Of or relating to metallurgy. <i>Metallurgical engineer.</i>

monograph	Write a monograph on treat in a monograph. <i>They are publishing a series of monographs on music in late medieval and Renaissance cities.</i>
ornithologist	A zoologist who studies birds.
<u>philosopher</u>	A wise person who is calm and rational; someone who lives a life of reason with equanimity.
philosophy	Any personal belief about how to live or how to deal with a situation. <i>My father s philosophy of child rearing was to let mother do it.</i>
<u>scholar</u>	A student who holds a scholarship. <i>A Rhodes scholar.</i>
<u>scholarly</u>	Having or showing knowledge, learning, or devotion to academic pursuits. <i>A scholarly account of the period.</i>
sophism	A clever but false argument, especially one used deliberately to deceive.
sophist	A paid teacher of philosophy and rhetoric in Greece in the Classical and Hellenistic periods, associated in popular thought with moral scepticism and specious reasoning.
sophistry	The use of clever but false arguments, especially with the intention of deceiving. <i>Trying to argue that I had benefited in any way from the disaster was pure sophistry.</i>
statistician	An expert in the preparation and analysis of statistics.
student	Denoting someone who is studying in order to enter a particular profession. <i>A maths student.</i>
syllogistic	Of or relating to or consisting of syllogism.
taxonomist	A biologist who specializes in the classification of organisms into groups on the basis of their structure and origin and behavior.
taxonomy	The branch of science concerned with classification, especially of organisms; systematics. <i>A taxonomy of smells.</i>
<u>tuition</u>	Teaching pupils individually (usually by a tutor hired privately). <i>I m not paying next year s tuition.</i>
<u>university</u>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>I went to university at the Sorbonne.</i>
