<b>academic</b>	Not of practical relevance; of only theoretical interest. <i>The debate has been largely <b>academic</b>.</i>
<b>academician</b>	Someone elected to honorary membership in an academy.
<b><u>disciple</u></b>	A personal follower of Christ during his life, especially one of the twelve Apostles. <i>A <b>disciple</b> of Rousseau.</i>
<b>economist</b>	An expert in the science of economics.
<b>educated</b>	Having been educated. <i>A Harvard <b>educated</b> lawyer.</i>
<b><u>erudite</u></b>	Having or showing great knowledge or learning. <i>An <b>erudite</b> professor.</i>
<b>geometer</b>	A person skilled in geometry.
<b><u>historian</u></b>	An expert in or student of history, especially that of a particular period, geographical region, or social phenomenon. <i>A military <b>historian</b>.</i>
<b><u>intellectual</u></b>	A person who uses the mind creatively. <i>Children need <b>intellectual</b> stimulation.</i>
<b>knowledge</b>	Facts, information, and skills acquired through experience or education; the theoretical or practical understanding of a subject. <i>Her considerable <b>knowledge</b> of antiques.</i>
<b>literati</b>	The literary intelligentsia.
<b>logician</b>	A person skilled at symbolic logic. <i>A leading mathematical <b>logician</b>.</i>
<b>mathematician</b>	A person skilled in mathematics. <i>One of the world's foremost theoretical <b>mathematicians</b>.</i>
<b>metallurgical</b>	Of or relating to metallurgy. <i><b>Metallurgical</b> engineer.</i>

<b>monograph</b>	Write a monograph on treat in a monograph. <i>They are publishing a series of <b>monographs</b> on music in late medieval and Renaissance cities.</i>
<b>ornithologist</b>	A zoologist who studies birds.
<b><u>philosopher</u></b>	A wise person who is calm and rational; someone who lives a life of reason with equanimity.
<b>philosophy</b>	Any personal belief about how to live or how to deal with a situation. <i>My father s <b>philosophy</b> of child rearing was to let mother do it.</i>
<b><u>scholar</u></b>	A student who holds a scholarship. <i>A Rhodes <b>scholar</b>.</i>
<b><u>scholarly</u></b>	Having or showing knowledge, learning, or devotion to academic pursuits. <i>A <b>scholarly</b> account of the period.</i>
<b>sophism</b>	A clever but false argument, especially one used deliberately to deceive.
<b>sophist</b>	A paid teacher of philosophy and rhetoric in Greece in the Classical and Hellenistic periods, associated in popular thought with moral scepticism and specious reasoning.
<b>sophistry</b>	The use of clever but false arguments, especially with the intention of deceiving. <i>Trying to argue that I had benefited in any way from the disaster was pure <b>sophistry</b>.</i>
<b>statistician</b>	An expert in the preparation and analysis of statistics.
<b>student</b>	Denoting someone who is studying in order to enter a particular profession. <i>A maths <b>student</b>.</i>
<b>sylogistic</b>	Of or relating to or consisting of syllogism.
<b>taxonomist</b>	A biologist who specializes in the classification of organisms into groups on the basis of their structure and origin and behavior.
<b>taxonomy</b>	The branch of science concerned with classification, especially of organisms; systematics. <i>A <b>taxonomy</b> of smells.</i>
<b><u>tuition</u></b>	Teaching pupils individually (usually by a tutor hired privately). <i>I m not paying next year s <b>tuition</b>.</i>
<b><u>university</u></b>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>I went to <b>university</b> at the Sorbonne.</i>
