assets	Anything of material value or usefulness that is owned by a person or company.
capital	The federal government of the United States. <i>Rates of return on invested capital were high.</i>
<u>currency</u>	The metal or paper medium of exchange that is presently used. <i>The currency of a slang term.</i>
finance	The branch of economics that studies the management of money and other assets. <i>The clearing banks are important sources of finance.</i>
funds	Assets in the form of money.
investment capital	The act of investing; laying out money or capital in an enterprise with the expectation of profit.
john cash	United States country music singer and songwriter (1932-2003).

johnny cash	Prompt payment for goods or services in currency or by check.
means	An action or system by which a result is achieved; a method. <i>Technology seen as a means to bring about emancipation.</i>
money	Wealth reckoned in terms of money. <i>The main aim of a commercial organization is to make money.</i>
ready cash	Poised for action.
ready money	Poised for action.
resources	Available source of wealth; a new or reserve supply that can be drawn upon when needed. <i>A man of resource.</i>
<u>wherewithal</u>	The necessary means (especially financial means). <i>They lacked the wherewithal to pay.</i>

Cash as a Verb

Definitions of "Cash" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "cash" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Give or obtain notes or coins for (a cheque or money order).*
- *Lead (a high card) so as to take the opportunity to win a trick.*

- *Exchange for cash.*



Synonyms of "Cash" as a verb (10 Words)

cash in	Exchange for cash.
change	Exchange a sum of money for the same sum in a different currency or denomination. <i>She changed completely as she grew older.</i>
convert into cash	Score an extra point or points after touchdown by kicking the ball through the uprights or advancing the ball into the end zone.
convert into money	Exchange a penalty for a less severe one.
encash	Convert (a cheque, money order, bond, etc.) into money. <i>After the payment of one year's contribution you may encash your bond at any time.</i>

exchange	Exchange or replace with another usually of the same kind or category. <i>He exchanged a concerned glance with Stephen.</i>
liquidate	Wind up the affairs of (a business) by ascertaining liabilities and apportioning assets. <i>I had to liquidate my holdings to pay off my ex husband.</i>
realize	Achieve (something desired or anticipated); fulfil. <i>He realized his mistake at once.</i>
turn into cash	Accomplish by rotating.
turn into money	Direct at someone.



Usage Examples of "Cash" as a verb

- *I cashed the check as soon as it arrived in the mail.*
- *South cashed the ace, king, and queen of clubs.*
- *The bank cashed her cheque.*



Associations of "Cash" (30 Words)

annuitant	The recipient of an annuity.
bill	A poster or handbill. <i>He had been billed 3 000 for his licence.</i>
<u>consumer</u>	A person or thing that eats or uses something. <i>Recession hit consumers are being lured by cheap prices.</i>
cost	The effort, loss, or sacrifice necessary to achieve or obtain something. <i>Healthcare costs.</i>
cutback	An act or instance of reducing something, especially expenditure. <i>Cutbacks in defence spending.</i>
<u>deposit</u>	The natural process of laying down a deposit of something. <i>Beds where salt is deposited by the tide.</i>
disbursement	The act of spending or disbursing money. <i>They established a committee to supervise the disbursement of aid.</i>

earnings	Something that remunerates. <i>They saved a quarter of all their earnings.</i>
emolument	Compensation received by virtue of holding an office or having employment (usually in the form of wages or fees). <i>A clause in the U S constitution prevents sitting legislators from receiving emoluments from their own votes.</i>
<u>expenditure</u>	The use of energy, time, or other resources. <i>Cuts in public expenditure.</i>
expense	Offset an item of expenditure as an expense against taxable income. <i>His hotel and travel expenses.</i>
honorarium	A fee paid for a nominally free service.
<u>income</u>	The financial gain (earned or unearned) accruing over a given period of time. <i>He has a nice home and an adequate income.</i>
outlay	The act of spending or disbursing money. <i>A modest outlay on local advertising.</i>
payment	An amount paid or payable. <i>Three interest free monthly payments.</i>
rates	A local tax on property (usually used in the plural).
<u>receipt</u>	Report the receipt of. <i>Box office receipts.</i>
refund	Pay back money to. <i>If you re not delighted with your purchase we guarantee to refund your money in full.</i>
reimbursement	A sum paid to cover money that has been spent or lost. <i>Reimbursement of everyday medical costs.</i>
remuneration	The act of paying for goods or services or to recompense for losses. <i>Adequate remuneration for his work.</i>
<u>reparation</u>	(usually plural) compensation exacted from a defeated nation by the victors. <i>The old hall was pulled down to avoid the cost of reparation.</i>
repayment	The action of paying back a loan. <i>Minimum monthly repayments.</i>
<u>revenue</u>	The department of the civil service collecting state revenue. <i>His priority was to raise government revenue and to lower expenditure.</i>
reward	Bestow honor or rewards upon. <i>The engineer who supervised the work was rewarded with the MBE.</i>

spending	The act of spending or disbursing money.
spendthrift	A person who spends money in an extravagant, irresponsible way. <i>Putt was a spendthrift and a heavy gambler.</i>
spree	Take part in a spree. <i>A shopping spree.</i>
taxation	Government income due to taxation. <i>A taxation system.</i>
vat	Place or treat in a vat. <i>A vat of hot tar.</i>
wage	Carry on (a war or campaign). <i>An income of less than half the average wage.</i>
