## Associations of "Cast out" (30 Words)

<a href="#">aside</a>	A remark not intended to be heard by everyone present. <i>Does that make him a murderer whispered Alice in an <b>aside</b> to Fred.</i>
<a href="#">astray</a>	Away from the correct path or direction. <i>We went <b>astray</b> but a man redirected us.</i>
<a href="#">away</a>	Out of the way especially away from one's thoughts. <i>The Museum has shifted its emphasis <b>away</b> from research towards exhibitions.</i>
<b>beggar</b>	Reduce to beggary. <i>This <b>beggars</b> description.</i>
<a href="#">deviate</a>	A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior. <i>You must not <b>deviate</b> from the agreed route.</i>
<a href="#">digress</a>	Leave the main subject temporarily in speech or writing. <i>Don't <b>digress</b> when you give a lecture.</i>
<b>divagation</b>	A message that departs from the main subject.
<a href="#">drift</a>	Be subject to fluctuation. <i>Sand <b>drifting</b> like snow.</i>
<b>err</b>	To make a mistake or be incorrect. <i>The judge had <b>erred</b> in ruling that the evidence was inadmissible.</i>
<b>excursive</b>	Tending to depart from the main point or cover a wide range of subjects. <i>His <b>excursive</b> remarks.</i>
<a href="#">exhale</a>	Give off (vapour or fumes). <i>The chimney <b>exhales</b> a thick smoke.</i>
<b>gad</b>	An anxiety disorder characterized by chronic free-floating anxiety and such symptoms as tension or sweating or trembling or lightheadedness or irritability etc that has lasted for more than six months. <i>He had heard that I was <b>gadding</b> about with an airline stewardess.</i>

<b>going</b>	Advancing toward a goal. <i>The <b>going</b> was ideal here with short turf and a level surface.</i>
<b>hurl</b>	A ride in a vehicle; a lift. <i>He <b>hurled</b> himself into the job with enthusiasm.</i>
<b>hurtle</b>	Throw forcefully. <i>The trucks <b>hurtled</b> them through the grassland to the construction sites.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Marked by separation of or from usually contiguous elements. <i><b>Isolated</b> instances of rebellion.</i>
<b>itinerant</b>	A person who travels from place to place. <i><b>Itinerant</b> labor.</i>
<b>lunge</b>	An exercise or gymnastic movement resembling the lunge of a fencer. <i>Billy <b>lunged</b> his spear at the fish.</i>
<b>ramble</b>	Continue talking or writing in a desultory manner. <i>As a boy I <b>rambled</b> the fells around Dent.</i>
<b>rambling</b>	Spreading out in different directions or distributed irregularly. <i>A <b>rambling</b> man.</i>
<b>roam</b>	Move about aimlessly or without any destination, often in search of food or employment. <i>He let his mind <b>roam</b> as he walked.</i>
<b>rove</b>	Move about aimlessly or without any destination, often in search of food or employment. <i>A new exhibit will electrify campuses on its national <b>rove</b>.</i>
<b>sidetrack</b>	A well or borehole which runs partly to one side of the original line of drilling. <i>His monologue launches into too many rambling <b>sidetracks</b>.</i>
<b>stray</b>	A stray person or thing especially a domestic animal. <i>A few <b>stray</b> crumbs.</i>
<b>throw</b>	An act of throwing one's opponent in wrestling judo or a similar sport. <i>Occasionally a small child will <b>throw</b> a tantrum when denied something.</i>
<b>truant</b>	Of a pupil being a truant. <i>If my daughter had been <b>truanting</b> from school I would have been informed.</i>
<b>vagabond</b>	Anything that resembles a vagabond in having no fixed place. <i>Pirate ships were <b>vagabonds</b> of the sea.</i>
<b>wander</b>	An act or instance of wandering. <i>His attention had <b>wandered</b>.</i>
