Definitions of "Castle" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "castle" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A large building formerly occupied by a ruler and fortified against attack.
- A large and stately mansion.
- The piece that can move any number of unoccupied squares in a direction parallel to the sides of the chessboard.
- A magnificent and imposing old mansion.
- (chess) the piece that can move any number of unoccupied squares in a direction parallel to the sides of the chessboard.
- Interchanging the positions of the king and a rook.
- A large building, typically of the medieval period, fortified against attack with thick walls, battlements, towers, and in many cases a moat.





Synonyms of "Castle" as a noun (19 Words)

castling	Interchanging the positions of the king and a rook. Castling is more frequently a defensive than an attacking move.
chateau	An impressive country house (or castle) in France. <i>Château Margaux.</i>
<u>citadel</u>	A meeting hall of the Salvation Army. <i>Citadels of private economic power.</i>
country house	A politically organized body of people under a single government.
donjon	The main tower within the walls of a medieval castle or fortress.
fastness	A strongly fortified defensive structure. A remote Himalayan mountain fastness .
<u>fort</u>	A fortified defensive structure. The city was guarded by a ring of fort s.
fortification	Defensive structure consisting of walls or mounds built around a stronghold to strengthen it. <i>A medieval fortification</i> .
<u>fortress</u>	A person or thing not susceptible to outside influence or disturbance. <i>He had proved himself to be a</i> fortress <i>of moral rectitude.</i>
<u>hall</u>	A large and imposing house. <i>Pool hall.</i>
<u>keep</u>	The strongest or central tower of a castle, acting as a final refuge. The Society are paying for your keep .
manor	The landed estate of a lord (including the house on it. A Tudor manor house in the English countryside.
manor house	The landed estate of a lord (including the house on it.



mansion	A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle Mansions.</i>
<u>palace</u>	The governing group of a kingdom. The palace issued an order binding on all subjects.
peel	An act of exfoliating dead skin in the cosmetic treatment of microdermabrasion. <i>Pieces of potato peel</i> .
rook	(chess) the piece that can move any number of unoccupied squares in a direction parallel to the sides of the chessboard.
<u>stronghold</u>	A place where a particular cause or belief is strongly defended or upheld. <i>A Labour stronghold.</i>
<u>tower</u>	Anything that approximates the shape of a column or tower. A CD tower .

cantonment	Temporary living quarters specially built by the army for soldiers.



<u>citadel</u>	A stronghold into which people could go for shelter during a battle. <i>Citadels of private economic power.</i>
diadem	The authority or dignity symbolized by a crown. <i>He refused the diadem of all the Caesars.</i>
<u>emperor</u>	Large richly colored butterfly. <i>He became emperor in 1930.</i>
<u>empire</u>	A group of countries under a single authority. <i>The British created a great empire</i> .
<u>fort</u>	Station troops in a fort. The city was guarded by a ring of fort s.
<u>fortress</u>	A military stronghold, especially a strongly fortified town. <i>He had proved himself to be a fortress of moral rectitude</i> .
<u>frontier</u>	An international boundary or the area (often fortified) immediately inside the boundary. <i>His novel of the American frontier</i> .
garrison	The building occupied by a garrison. Forces from these garrison s have been used against governments.
<u>imperial</u>	Belonging to or befitting a supreme ruler. Golden age of imperial splendor.
<u>kingdom</u>	A monarchy with a king or queen as head of state. <i>The kingdom of dreams.</i>
legionary	Of an ancient Roman legion. The legionary fortress of Isca.
majestically	In a majestic manner. The steep slopes of the valley floor rise majestically skywards.
medieval	As if belonging to the Middle Ages; old-fashioned and unenlightened. Without other people around I would let my flat degenerate into medieval levels of squalor.
<u>noble</u>	Especially in former times a person of noble rank or birth. A noble gas such as helium or neon.
outpost	A station in a remote or sparsely populated location. A few scattered outpost s along the west coast.
<u>palace</u>	A large, splendid house or place of entertainment. <i>The royal palace</i> .
pope	The head of the Roman Catholic Church.
<u>protector</u>	A person who cares for persons or property. A man who became her protector adviser and friend.



<u>royal</u>	A sail set next above the topgallant on a royal mast. The coalition obtained royal approval for the appointment.
<u>siege</u>	A military operation in which enemy forces surround a town or building, cutting off essential supplies, with the aim of compelling those inside to surrender. <i>There is a siege of herons at the river.</i>
sortie	An attempt to participate in a new activity or sphere. <i>We ll soon know if they sortie.</i>
stockade	Surround with a stockade in order to fortify. They built stockade s around their towns.
<u>stronghold</u>	A strongly fortified defensive structure. A Labour stronghold .
temple	A thing regarded as holy or likened to a temple especially a person s body. <i>The veins in his temple throbbed.</i>
ukase	An edict of the Russian tsar. <i>He was defying the publisher in the very building from which he had issued his ukase.</i>
<u>warrior</u>	(especially in former times) a brave or experienced soldier or fighter. I really love the warrior pose it makes me feel centred and strong.
