Definitions of "Cater" as a verb

- *Provide food and drink for (an event).*
- *Supply food ready to eat; for parties and banquets.*
- *Provide people with food and drink at a social event or other gathering.*
- *Give what is desired or needed, especially support, food or sustenance.*

cook for	Prepare a hot meal.
feed	Feed into supply. <i>Feed the lawn in spring and autumn.</i>
ply	Apply oneself diligently. <i>Ply fabric.</i>
provide	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>The Bill provides for the setting of guaranteed service standards.</i>
provide food for	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for; permit to be attainable or cause to remain.
provide for	Mount or put up.
provision	Supply with provisions. <i>The provisioning of US ships.</i>

regale	Entertain or amuse (someone) with talk. <i>He regaled her with a colourful account of that afternoon s meeting.</i>
serve	Do duty or hold offices serve in a specific function. <i>A hospital which serves a large area of Wales.</i>
supply	State or say further. <i>When she died no one could supply her place.</i>
wine and dine	Drink wine.



Usage Examples of "Cater" as a verb

- *My mother helped to cater for the party.*
- *He catered a lunch for 20 people.*

- adduce** Advance evidence for.
*A number of factors are **adduced** to explain the situation.*
- adequately** In an adequate manner or to an adequate degree.
*The job requirements were not **adequately** explained.*
- afford** Afford access to.
*The rooftop terrace **affords** beautiful views.*
- amortization** The action or process of gradually writing off the initial cost of an asset.
*An **amortization** schedule shows your payments each month and how it affects the total amount you owe.*
- bookshop** A shop where books are sold.
- contracted** Reduced in size or pulled together.
*The **contracted** pupils of her eyes.*

customer	Someone who pays for goods or services. <i>He s a tough customer.</i>
deliver	Deliver a speech oration or idea. <i>The guard delivered the criminal to the police.</i>
equip	Provide with abilities or understanding. <i>They equipped themselves for the campaign.</i>
furnish	Provide (a house or room) with furniture and fittings. <i>We furnished the house in the Biedermeyer style.</i>
grocer	A person who sells food and small household goods.
needs	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must needs by objective.</i>
outpace	Go, rise, or improve faster than. <i>He outpaced all six defenders.</i>
procurement	The act of getting possession of something. <i>Financial assistance for the procurement of legal advice.</i>
provide	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>The Bill provides for the setting of guaranteed service standards.</i>
provider	A person or thing that provides something. <i>A leading provider of personal financial services.</i>
provision	Supply with provisions. <i>The provisioning of US ships.</i>
pub	Tavern consisting of a building with a bar and public rooms often provides light meals. <i>Sometimes we would catch the train into Oxford and go pubbing.</i>
purvey	Spread or promote (an idea, view, etc). <i>We didn t want to purvey gloom and doom.</i>
purveyor	A person who sells or deals in particular goods. <i>A purveyor of large luxury vehicles.</i>
render	Give up surrender. <i>The eyes and the cheeks are exceptionally well rendered.</i>
replenish	Fill something that had previously been emptied. <i>All creatures need sleep to replenish their energies.</i>
restaurant	A place where people pay to sit and eat meals that are cooked and served on the premises.
restock	Stock again. <i>He restocked his land with pheasants.</i>

service	Perform a service or services for someone. <i>He retired after 30 years of service.</i>
shop	Do one's shopping. <i>She shopped her husband to bosses for taking tools home.</i>
supplement	A supplementary component that improves capability. <i>I looked for a part time job to supplement my income.</i>
supplier	Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity. <i>Every major energy supplier upped their prices.</i>
supply	The activity of supplying or providing something. <i>A supply teacher.</i>
vouchsafe	Grant in a condescending manner. <i>You'd never vouchsafed that interesting titbit before.</i>
