## Cater as a Verb

### Definitions of "Cater" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “cater” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Provide food and drink for (an event).*
- *Supply food ready to eat; for parties and banquets.*
- *Provide people with food and drink at a social event or other gathering.*
- *Give what is desired or needed, especially support, food or sustenance.*



## Synonyms of "Cater" as a verb (11 Words)

<b>cook for</b>	Prepare a hot meal.
<b>feed</b>	Feed into supply. <i><b>Feed</b> the lawn in spring and autumn.</i>
<b>ply</b>	Apply oneself diligently. <i><b>Ply</b> fabric.</i>
<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>The Bill <b>provides</b> for the setting of guaranteed service standards.</i>
<b>provide food for</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for; permit to be attainable or cause to remain.
<b>provide for</b>	Mount or put up.
<b>provision</b>	Supply with provisions. <i>The <b>provisioning</b> of US ships.</i>

<b>regale</b>	Entertain or amuse (someone) with talk. <i>He <b>regaled</b> her with a colourful account of that afternoon s meeting.</i>
<b>serve</b>	Do duty or hold offices serve in a specific function. <i>A hospital which <b>serves</b> a large area of Wales.</i>
<b>supply</b>	State or say further. <i>When she died no one could <b>supply</b> her place.</i>
<b>wine and dine</b>	Drink wine.



### Usage Examples of "Cater" as a verb

- *My mother helped to cater for the party.*
- *He catered a lunch for 20 people.*



## Associations of "Cater" (30 Words)

- adduce** Advance evidence for.  
*A number of factors are **adduced** to explain the situation.*
- adequately** In an adequate manner or to an adequate degree.  
*The job requirements were not **adequately** explained.*
- afford** Afford access to.  
*The rooftop terrace **affords** beautiful views.*
- amortization** The action or process of gradually writing off the initial cost of an asset.  
*An **amortization** schedule shows your payments each month and how it affects the total amount you owe.*
- bookshop** A shop where books are sold.
- contracted** Reduced in size or pulled together.  
*The **contracted** pupils of her eyes.*

<b>customer</b>	Someone who pays for goods or services. <i>He s a tough <b>customer</b>.</i>
<b>deliver</b>	Deliver a speech oration or idea. <i>The guard <b>delivered</b> the criminal to the police.</i>
<b>equip</b>	Provide with abilities or understanding. <i>They <b>equipped</b> themselves for the campaign.</i>
<b>furnish</b>	Provide (a house or room) with furniture and fittings. <i>We <b>furnished</b> the house in the Biedermeyer style.</i>
<b>grocer</b>	A person who sells food and small household goods.
<b>needs</b>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>
<b>outpace</b>	Go, rise, or improve faster than. <i>He <b>outpaced</b> all six defenders.</i>
<b>procurement</b>	The act of getting possession of something. <i>Financial assistance for the <b>procurement</b> of legal advice.</i>
<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>The Bill <b>provides</b> for the setting of guaranteed service standards.</i>
<b>provider</b>	A person or thing that provides something. <i>A leading <b>provider</b> of personal financial services.</i>
<b>provision</b>	Supply with provisions. <i>The <b>provisioning</b> of US ships.</i>
<b>pub</b>	Tavern consisting of a building with a bar and public rooms often provides light meals. <i>Sometimes we would catch the train into Oxford and go <b>pubbing</b>.</i>
<b>purvey</b>	Spread or promote (an idea, view, etc). <i>We didn t want to <b>purvey</b> gloom and doom.</i>
<b>purveyor</b>	A person who sells or deals in particular goods. <i>A <b>purveyor</b> of large luxury vehicles.</i>
<b>render</b>	Give up surrender. <i>The eyes and the cheeks are exceptionally well <b>rendered</b>.</i>
<b>replenish</b>	Fill something that had previously been emptied. <i>All creatures need sleep to <b>replenish</b> their energies.</i>
<b>restaurant</b>	A place where people pay to sit and eat meals that are cooked and served on the premises.
<b>restock</b>	Stock again. <i>He <b>restocked</b> his land with pheasants.</i>

<b>service</b>	Perform a service or services for someone. <i>He retired after 30 years of <b>service</b>.</i>
<b>shop</b>	Do one's shopping. <i>She <b>shopped</b> her husband to bosses for taking tools home.</i>
<b>supplement</b>	A supplementary component that improves capability. <i>I looked for a part time job to <b>supplement</b> my income.</i>
<b>supplier</b>	Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity. <i>Every major energy <b>supplier</b> upped their prices.</i>
<b>supply</b>	The activity of supplying or providing something. <i>A <b>supply</b> teacher.</i>
<b>vouchsafe</b>	Grant in a condescending manner. <i>You'd never <b>vouchsafed</b> that interesting titbit before.</i>
