lenitive	Remedy that eases pain and discomfort.
physic	Medicinal drugs. A physic for wives to give to impotent husbands.
purgative	A laxative. A widely employed and useful purgative .







<u>cognition</u>	A perception sensation idea or intuition resulting from the process of cognition.
conceptualize	Form a concept or idea of (something. Sex was conceptualize d as an overpowering force in the individual.
emotion	Any strong feeling. Responses have to be based on historical insight not simply on emotion .
emotional	Of more than usual emotion. An emotional speech.
expression	Expression without words. His manner of expression showed how much he cared.



feeling	The capacity to experience the sense of touch. She was a feeling child.
intangibility	The quality of being intangible and not perceptible by touch.
ire	Belligerence aroused by a real or supposed wrong (personified as one of the deadly sins. The plans provoked the ire of conservationists.
jealousy	The state or feeling of being jealous. A sharp pang of jealousy .
lyrical	Suitable for or suggestive of singing. The lyrical content of his songs.
madden	Cause to go crazy; cause to lose one's mind. <i>His behavior is maddening.</i>
maladjustment	The condition of being unable to adapt properly to your environment with resulting emotional instability. Children of parents with chronic illness are at risk of psychological maladjustment .
mawkish	Effusively or insincerely emotional. The mawkish smell of warm beer.
<u>mental</u>	Relating to the mind. A quick mental calculation.
<u>moody</u>	Giving an impression of melancholy or mystery. <i>His moody adolescent brother.</i>
<u>pathos</u>	A style that has the power to evoke feelings. The actor injects his customary humour and pathos into the role.
<u>psychic</u>	The study of psychic phenomena. <i>Psychic energy.</i>
<u>psychological</u>	Of or relating to or determined by psychology. <i>Psychological research</i> .
psychologist	A scientist trained in psychology. A sports psychologist .
<u>psychology</u>	The mental characteristics or attitude of a person or group. The psychology of child killers.
semiconscious	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.
<u>sensibility</u>	The quality of being able to appreciate and respond to complex emotional or aesthetic influences; sensitivity. <i>Cruelty offended his sensibility.</i>



<u>sentiment</u>	Tender, romantic, or nostalgic feeling or emotion. I agree with your sentiment s regarding the road bridge.
<u>sentimental</u>	Given to or marked by sentiment or sentimentality. <i>Sentimental soap operas.</i>
superego	(psychoanalysis) that part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>True schizophrenias lack the superego elements present in paranoia.</i>
telepathy	The supposed communication of thoughts or ideas by means other than the known senses.
thinking	Using thought or rational judgement; intelligent. <i>Thinking</i> always made him frown.
touched	Slightly insane. You have to be a little touched to do my job.
unsentimental	Facing facts or difficulties realistically and with determination. The speeches were short and unsentimental .
