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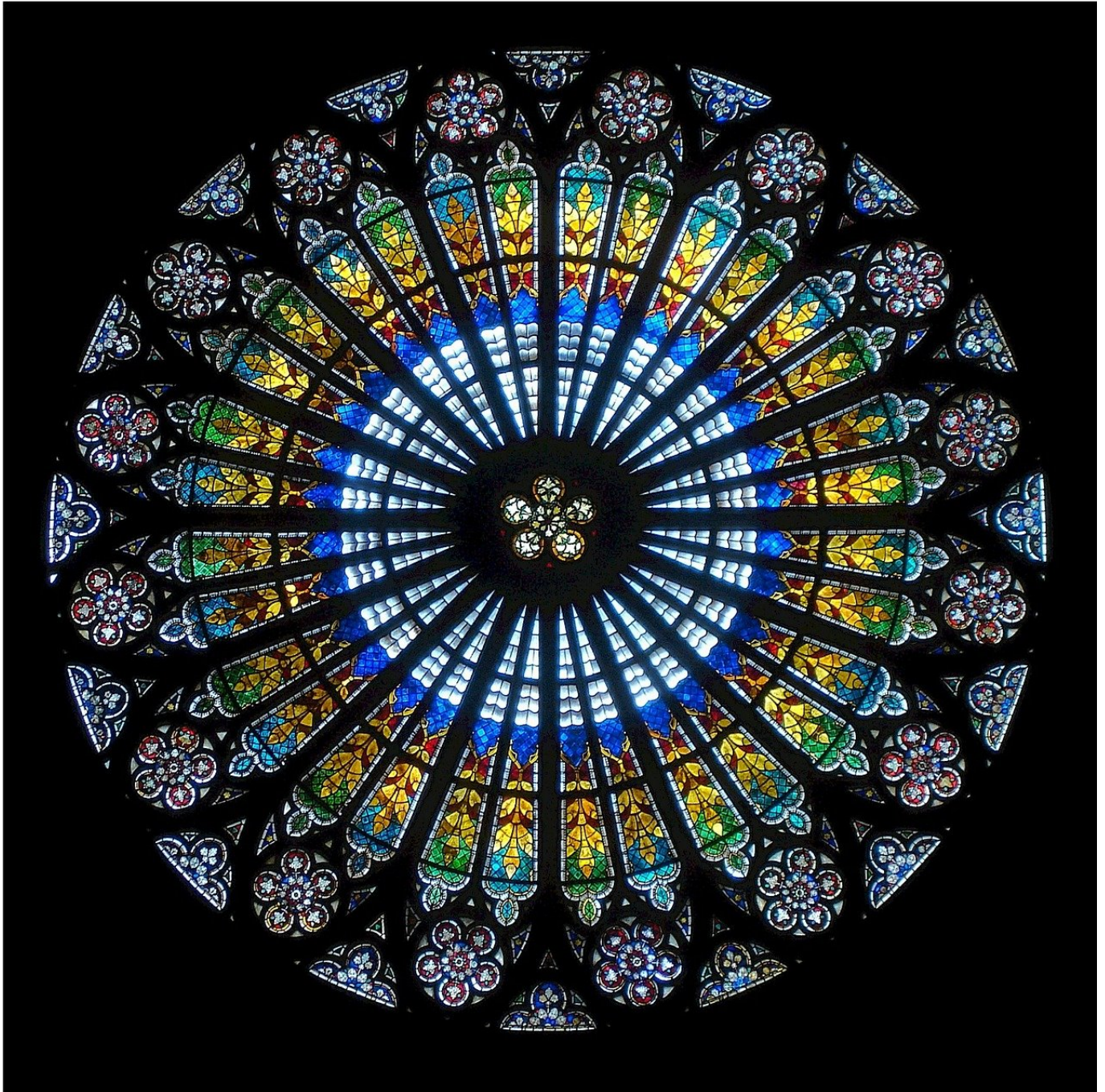

### **Definitions of "Cathedral" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “cathedral” as a noun can have the following definitions:

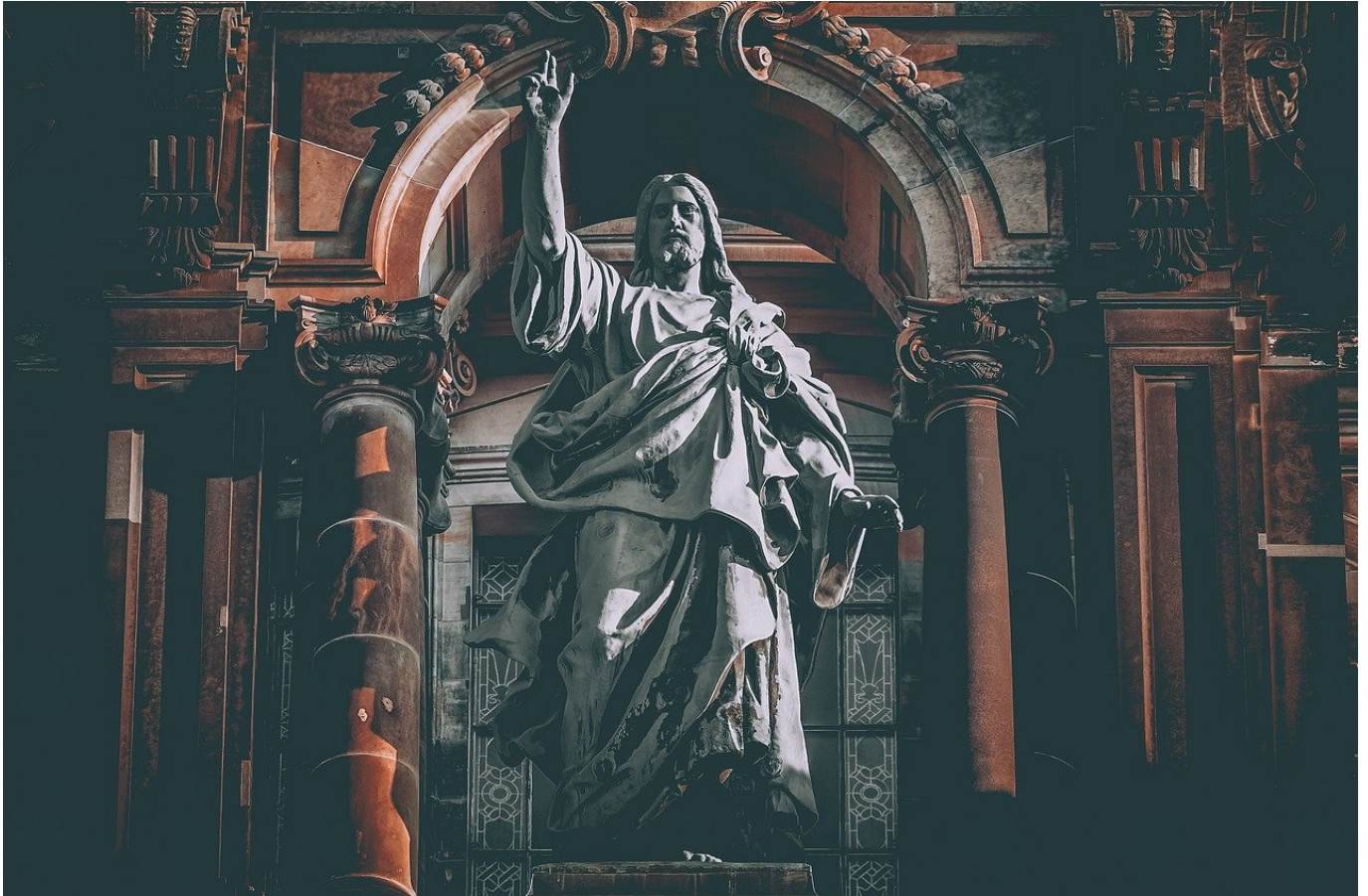
- *The principal Christian church building of a bishop's diocese.*
- *Any large and important church.*
- *The principal church of a diocese, with which the bishop is officially associated.*

**duomo** The principal Christian church building of a bishop's diocese.

## Associations of "Cathedral" (30 Words)

**abbess** The superior of a group of nuns.

**abbey** A church that was formerly an abbey.

**abbot** The superior of an abbey of monks.

**apocrypha** 14 books of the Old Testament included in the Vulgate (except for II Esdras) but omitted in Jewish and Protestant versions of the Bible; eastern Christian churches (except the Coptic Church) accept all these books as canonical; the Russian Orthodox Church accepts these texts as divinely inspired but does not grant them the same status.

**archdeacon** A senior Christian cleric (in the early Church a deacon, in the modern Anglican Church a priest) to whom a bishop delegates certain responsibilities.

**augustinian** A Roman Catholic friar or monk belonging to one of the Augustinian monastic orders.

<b>bishop</b>	A chess piece typically with its top shaped like a mitre that can move in any direction along a diagonal on which it stands Each player starts the game with two bishops one moving on white squares and the other on black.
<b>buddhist</b>	One who follows the teachings of Buddha.
<b>canon</b>	A priest who is a member of a cathedral chapter. <i>The biblical <b>canon</b>.</i>
<b>catholic</b>	A member of a Catholic church. <i><b>Catholic</b> in one s tastes.</i>
<b>church</b>	Take a woman who has recently given birth to church for a service of thanksgiving. <i>Some people go to <b>church</b> every Sunday.</i>
<b>cloister</b>	Seclude from the world in or as if in a cloister. <i>He was inclined more to the <b>cloister</b> than the sword.</i>
<b>convent</b>	A school attached to and run by a convent. <i>Maria entered the <b>convent</b> at the age of eighteen.</i>
<b>dean</b>	The head of a university faculty or department or of a medical school. <i>He is the <b>dean</b> of foreign correspondents.</i>
<b>diocese</b>	A district under the pastoral care of a bishop in the Christian Church.
<b>doyen</b>	A man who is the senior member of a group. <i>He became the <b>doyen</b> of British physicists.</i>
<b>gothic</b>	Characteristic of the style of type commonly used for printing German. <i><b>Gothic</b> novels like Frankenstein.</i>
<b>holy</b>	A sacred place of pilgrimage. <i>Saints and <b>holy</b> men.</i>
<b>minster</b>	Any of certain cathedrals and large churches; originally connected to a monastery. <i>York <b>Minster</b>.</i>
<b>monastery</b>	The residence of a religious community.
<b>monastic</b>	A monk or other follower of a monastic rule. <i>She set her things round the <b>monastic</b> student bedroom.</i>
<b>nunnery</b>	The convent of a community of nuns.
<b>parish</b>	(in the Christian Church) a small administrative district typically having its own church and a priest or pastor. <i>A <b>parish</b> councillor.</i>
<b>priest</b>	Ordain to the priesthood. <i>The <b>priest</b> celebrated mass at a small altar off the north transept.</i>
<b>priory</b>	A small monastery or nunnery that is governed by a prior or prioress.



- pyx** In the UK a box at the Royal Mint in which specimen gold and silver coins are deposited to be tested annually at the trial of the pyx by members of the Goldsmiths Company.
- rector** (in the Roman Catholic Church) a priest in charge of a church or of a religious institution.
- religion** A strong belief in a supernatural power or powers that control human destiny.  
*He was raised in the Baptist **religion**.*
- saint** Formally recognize as a saint canonize.  
*A place dedicated to a seventh century **saint**.*
- theology** The rational and systematic study of religion and its influences and of the nature of religious truth.  
*In Christian **theology** God comes to be conceived as Father and Son.*
