| ill-natured | Having an irritable and unpleasant disposition. |
| malevolent | Having or exerting a malignant influence. <i>Failure made him malevolent toward those who were successful.</i> |
| malicious | Having the nature of or resulting from malice. <i>The transmission of malicious software such as computer viruses.</i> |
| malign | Of a disease malignant. <i>Believed in witches and malign spirits.</i> |
| malignant | Dangerous to health; characterized by progressive and uncontrolled growth (especially of a tumor). <i>In the hands of malignant fate.</i> |
| mean | (used of sums of money) so small in amount as to deserve contempt. <i>Choked with ambition of the meaner sort.</i> |
| nasty | Characterized by obscenity. <i>Will he say nasty things at my funeral.</i> |
| poisonous | Having the qualities or effects of a poison. <i>Poisonous chemicals.</i> |
| rancorous | Showing deep-seated resentment- Aldous Huxley. <i>Sixteen miserable months of rancorous disputes.</i> |
| snide | Derogatory or mocking in an indirect way. <i>Makes many a sharp comparison but never a mean or snide one.</i> |
| splenetic | Bad-tempered; spiteful. <i>A splenetic rant.</i> |
| unfriendly | Not disposed to friendship or friendliness. <i>She shot him an unfriendly glance.</i> |
| unkind | Lacking kindness. <i>You were terribly unkind to her.</i> |
| vengeful | Disposed to seek revenge or intended for revenge- Shakespeare- M.R.Cohen. <i>A vengeful ex con.</i> |

| venomous | Marked by deep ill will; deliberately harmful. <i>The box jellyfish is earth's most venomous creature.</i> |
| vicious | Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. Vicious gossip. |
| vindictive | Having or showing a strong or unreasoning desire for revenge. <i>The criticism was both vindictive and personalized.</i> |
| vitriolic | Harsh or corrosive in tone. Vitriolic outbursts. |
| wounding | Causing physical injury. Wounding and false charges of disloyalty. |
