<b>acid</b>	Having the characteristics of an acid. <i>The magma may start off fairly basic and end up at the close of the eruption much more <b>acid</b>.</i>
<b>baleful</b>	Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments. <i>The Florida eagles have a fierce <b>baleful</b> look.</i>
<b>barbed</b>	Having a barb or barbs. <i>A fair degree of <b>barbed</b> wit.</i>
<b>bilious</b>	Affected by or associated with nausea or vomiting. <i>A <b>bilious</b> yellow hue.</i>
<b>bitter</b>	Causing a sharp and acrid taste experience. <i>I don t feel jealous or <b>bitter</b>.</i>
<b>cattish</b>	Marked by or arising from malice.
<b>cruel</b>	(of persons or their actions) able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. <i>The winters are long hard and <b>cruel</b>.</i>

<b>cutting</b>	Capable of cutting something. <i><b>Cutting</b> remarks.</i>
<b>hateful</b>	Arousing, deserving of, or filled with hatred. <i>A <b>hateful</b> thing to do.</i>
<b>hostile</b>	Opposed. <i>People are very <b>hostile</b> to the idea.</i>
<b>hurtful</b>	Harmful to living things. <i>His <b>hurtful</b> remarks.</i>
<b>ill-natured</b>	Having an irritable and unpleasant disposition.
<b>malevolent</b>	Having or exerting a malignant influence. <i>Failure made him <b>malevolent</b> toward those who were successful.</i>
<b>malicious</b>	Having the nature of or resulting from malice. <i>The transmission of <b>malicious</b> software such as computer viruses.</i>
<b>malign</b>	Of a disease malignant. <i>Believed in witches and <b>malign</b> spirits.</i>
<b>malignant</b>	Dangerous to health; characterized by progressive and uncontrolled growth (especially of a tumor). <i>In the hands of <b>malignant</b> fate.</i>
<b>mean</b>	(used of sums of money) so small in amount as to deserve contempt. <i>Choked with ambition of the <b>meaner</b> sort.</i>
<b>nasty</b>	Characterized by obscenity. <i>Will he say <b>nasty</b> things at my funeral.</i>
<b>poisonous</b>	Having the qualities or effects of a poison. <i><b>Poisonous</b> chemicals.</i>
<b>rancorous</b>	Showing deep-seated resentment- Aldous Huxley. <i>Sixteen miserable months of <b>rancorous</b> disputes.</i>
<b>snide</b>	Derogatory or mocking in an indirect way. <i>Makes many a sharp comparison but never a mean or <b>snide</b> one.</i>
<b>splenetic</b>	Bad-tempered; spiteful. <i>A <b>splenetic</b> rant.</i>
<b>unfriendly</b>	Not disposed to friendship or friendliness. <i>She shot him an <b>unfriendly</b> glance.</i>
<b>unkind</b>	Lacking kindness. <i>You were terribly <b>unkind</b> to her.</i>
<b>vengeful</b>	Disposed to seek revenge or intended for revenge- Shakespeare- M.R.Cohen. <i>A <b>vengeful</b> ex con.</i>

<b>venomous</b>	Marked by deep ill will; deliberately harmful. <i>The box jellyfish is earth's most <b>venomous</b> creature.</i>
<b>vicious</b>	Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. <b>Vicious</b> gossip.
<b>vindictive</b>	Having or showing a strong or unreasoning desire for revenge. <i>The criticism was both <b>vindictive</b> and personalized.</i>
<b>vitriolic</b>	Harsh or corrosive in tone. <b>Vitriolic</b> outbursts.
<b>wounding</b>	Causing physical injury. <b>Wounding</b> and false charges of disloyalty.
