Associations of "Caught" (30 Words)

apprehend	Take into custody. <i>He is a man that apprehends death no more dreadfully but as a drunken sleep.</i>
arrest	Hold back, as of a danger or an enemy; check the expansion or influence of. <i>The church s stillness arrested her.</i>
capture	A person or thing that has been captured. <i>She captured all the men s hearts.</i>
carnivorous	(of an animal) feeding on other animals. <i>Carnivorous plants are capable of trapping and digesting small animals especially insects.</i>
cast	Make a moulded object by casting metal. <i>Votes have been cast in 40 per cent of the seats.</i>
clasp	Fasten with or as if with a brooch. <i>He took her hand in a firm clasp.</i>
clench	Grasp (something) tightly and firmly. <i>My stomach was clenched in a knot.</i>
clutch	A clutch bag. <i>They both are hard nosed players who seem to thrive in clutch situations.</i>
culprit	Someone who perpetrates wrongdoing. <i>Low level ozone pollution is the real culprit.</i>
dragnet	A conical fishnet dragged through the water at great depths. <i>Caught in the police dragnet.</i>
engage	Engage or hire for work. <i>Make sure the gear is engaged.</i>
forfeited	Surrendered as a penalty.
grab	Obtain or get (something) quickly or opportunistically. <i>I ve added frame grabs to give a good flavour of what the film is all about.</i>

grapple	Come to terms with. <i>Passers by grappled with the man after the knife attack.</i>
grasp	The act of grasping. <i>Edward grasped her by the wrist.</i>
grip	A hairgrip. <i>It was an old briefcase but it still had a good grip.</i>
hijack	An incident or act of hijacking. <i>A man armed with grenades hijacked the jet yesterday.</i>
hijacker	A person who steals goods by seizing them in transit. <i>These activists are the real hijackers of the revolution.</i>
impound	Lock up (someone). <i>Almost forgotten were the poor unfortunates impounded in the prison.</i>
imprison	Confine as if in a prison. <i>The suspects were imprisoned without trial.</i>
kidnap	The action of kidnapping someone. <i>They were arrested for robbery and kidnap.</i>
kidnapping	The unlawful act of capturing and carrying away a person against their will and holding them in false imprisonment. <i>The recent kidnapping of a Dutch industrialist.</i>
paralyze	Cause to be paralyzed and immobile. <i>The poison paralyzed him.</i>
predatory	Living by or given to victimizing others for personal gain. <i>Predatory warfare.</i>
prisoner	A person who is confined especially a prisoner of war. <i>A prisoner serving a life sentence.</i>
raptorial	Relating to or characteristic of birds of prey. <i>Raptorial front legs.</i>
ravening	Living by preying on other animals especially by catching living prey. <i>They turned on each other like ravening wolves.</i>
seize	Seize and take control without authority and possibly with force take as one's right or possession. <i>The patient was seized with unbearable pains.</i>
tongs	Any of various devices for taking hold of objects; usually have two hinged legs with handles above and pointed hooks below. <i>Sugar tongs.</i>
