## Associations of "Caught" (30 Words)

<b>apprehend</b>	Take into custody. <i>He is a man that <b>apprehends</b> death no more dreadfully but as a drunken sleep.</i>
<b>arrest</b>	Hold back, as of a danger or an enemy; check the expansion or influence of. <i>The church s stillness <b>arrested</b> her.</i>
<b>capture</b>	A person or thing that has been captured. <i>She <b>captured</b> all the men s hearts.</i>
<b>carnivorous</b>	(of an animal) feeding on other animals. <i><b>Carnivorous</b> plants are capable of trapping and digesting small animals especially insects.</i>
<b>cast</b>	Make a moulded object by casting metal. <i>Votes have been <b>cast</b> in 40 per cent of the seats.</i>
<b>clasp</b>	Fasten with or as if with a brooch. <i>He took her hand in a firm <b>clasp</b>.</i>
<b>clench</b>	Grasp (something) tightly and firmly. <i>My stomach was <b>clenched</b> in a knot.</i>
<b>clutch</b>	A clutch bag. <i>They both are hard nosed players who seem to thrive in <b>clutch</b> situations.</i>
<b>culprit</b>	Someone who perpetrates wrongdoing. <i>Low level ozone pollution is the real <b>culprit</b>.</i>
<b>dragnet</b>	A conical fishnet dragged through the water at great depths. <i>Caught in the police <b>dragnet</b>.</i>
<b>engage</b>	Engage or hire for work. <i>Make sure the gear is <b>engaged</b>.</i>
<b>forfeited</b>	Surrendered as a penalty.
<b>grab</b>	Obtain or get (something) quickly or opportunistically. <i>I ve added frame <b>grabs</b> to give a good flavour of what the film is all about.</i>

<b>grapple</b>	Come to terms with. <i>Passers by <b>grappled</b> with the man after the knife attack.</i>
<b>grasp</b>	The act of grasping. <i>Edward <b>grasped</b> her by the wrist.</i>
<b>grip</b>	A hairgrip. <i>It was an old briefcase but it still had a good <b>grip</b>.</i>
<b>hijack</b>	An incident or act of hijacking. <i>A man armed with grenades <b>hijacked</b> the jet yesterday.</i>
<b>hijacker</b>	A person who steals goods by seizing them in transit. <i>These activists are the real <b>hijackers</b> of the revolution.</i>
<b>impound</b>	Lock up (someone). <i>Almost forgotten were the poor unfortunates <b>impounded</b> in the prison.</i>
<b>imprison</b>	Confine as if in a prison. <i>The suspects were <b>imprisoned</b> without trial.</i>
<b>kidnap</b>	The action of kidnapping someone. <i>They were arrested for robbery and <b>kidnap</b>.</i>
<b>kidnapping</b>	The unlawful act of capturing and carrying away a person against their will and holding them in false imprisonment. <i>The recent <b>kidnapping</b> of a Dutch industrialist.</i>
<b>paralyze</b>	Cause to be paralyzed and immobile. <i>The poison <b>paralyzed</b> him.</i>
<b>predatory</b>	Living by or given to victimizing others for personal gain. <i><b>Predatory</b> warfare.</i>
<b>prisoner</b>	A person who is confined especially a prisoner of war. <i>A <b>prisoner</b> serving a life sentence.</i>
<b>raptorial</b>	Relating to or characteristic of birds of prey. <i><b>Raptorial</b> front legs.</i>
<b>ravening</b>	Living by preying on other animals especially by catching living prey. <i>They turned on each other like <b>ravening</b> wolves.</i>
<b>seize</b>	Seize and take control without authority and possibly with force take as one's right or possession. <i>The patient was <b>seized</b> with unbearable pains.</i>
<b>tongs</b>	Any of various devices for taking hold of objects; usually have two hinged legs with handles above and pointed hooks below. <i>Sugar <b>tongs</b>.</i>
