## Associations of "Caught" (30 Words)

apprehend	Take into custody. <i>He is a man that <b>apprehend</b>s death no more dreadfully but as a drunken sleep.</i>
arrest	Hold back, as of a danger or an enemy; check the expansion or influence of. <i>The church s stillness arrested her.</i>
capture	A person or thing that has been captured. She <b>capture</b> d all the men s hearts.
carnivorous	(of an animal) feeding on other animals. <b>Carnivorous</b> plants are capable of trapping and digesting small animals especially insects.
<u>cast</u>	Make a moulded object by casting metal. Votes have been <b>cast</b> in 40 per cent of the seats.
clasp	Fasten with or as if with a brooch. <i>He took her hand in a firm <b>clasp</b>.</i>
<u>clench</u>	Grasp (something) tightly and firmly. My stomach was <b>clench</b> ed in a knot.
clutch	A clutch bag. They both are hard nosed players who seem to thrive in <b>clutch</b> situations.
<u>culprit</u>	Someone who perpetrates wrongdoing. Low level ozone pollution is the real <b>culprit</b> .
dragnet	A conical fishnet dragged through the water at great depths. <i>Caught in the police <b>dragnet</b></i> .
<u>engage</u>	Engage or hire for work. Make sure the gear is <b>engage</b> d.
forfeited	Surrendered as a penalty.
<u>grab</u>	Obtain or get (something) quickly or opportunistically. I ve added frame <b>grab</b> s to give a good flavour of what the film is all about.



grapple	Come to terms with. Passers by <b>grapple</b> d with the man after the knife attack.
<u>grasp</u>	The act of grasping. Edward <b>grasp</b> ed her by the wrist.
grip	A hairgrip. It was an old briefcase but it still had a good <b>grip</b> .
<u>hijack</u>	An incident or act of hijacking. A man armed with grenades <b>hijack</b> ed the jet yesterday.
hijacker	A person who steals goods by seizing them in transit. These activists are the real <b>hijacker</b> s of the revolution.
impound	Lock up (someone. Almost forgotten were the poor unfortunates <b>impound</b> ed in the prison.
<u>imprison</u>	Confine as if in a prison. The suspects were <b>imprison</b> ed without trial.
<u>kidnap</u>	The action of kidnapping someone. They were arrested for robbery and <b>kidnap</b> .
kidnapping	The unlawful act of capturing and carrying away a person against their will and holding them in false imprisonment. The recent <b>kidnapping</b> of a Dutch industrialist.
paralyze	Cause to be paralyzed and immobile. The poison <b>paralyze</b> d him.
<u>predatory</u>	Living by or given to victimizing others for personal gain. <b>Predatory</b> warfare.
<u>prisoner</u>	A person who is confined especially a prisoner of war. A <b>prisoner</b> serving a life sentence.
raptorial	Relating to or characteristic of birds of prey. <i>Raptorial</i> front legs.
ravening	Living by preying on other animals especially by catching living prey. They turned on each other like <b>ravening</b> wolves.
seize	Seize and take control without authority and possibly with force take as one s right or possession. <i>The patient was</i> <b>seize</b> <i>d with unbearable pains.</i>
tongs	Any of various devices for taking hold of objects; usually have two hinged legs with handles above and pointed hooks below. <i>Sugar tongs</i> .
