## Associations of "Caught up" (30 Words)

<b>ascend</b>	Go back in order of genealogical succession. <i>The first traveller to <b>ascend</b> the mountain.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>Incomes ranked in <b>ascending</b> order of size.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	An instance of rising or moving up through the air. <i>The first <b>ascent</b> of the Matterhorn.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>He d had his wallet <b>boosted</b> in a bar.</i>
<b><u>climb</u></b>	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>The track <b>climbed</b> steeply up a narrow twisting valley.</i>
<b><u>climbing</u></b>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was <b>climbing</b> especially in the Alps.</i>
<b><u>elevate</u></b>	Increase the level of (something). <i>The field guns were <b>elevated</b> twenty degrees.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A machine consisting of an endless belt with scoops attached, used for raising grain to an upper storey for storage. <i>In the <b>elevator</b> she pressed the button for the lobby.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt.
<b>high</b>	A high place. <i>She wasn t tipsy just a little <b>high</b>.</i>
<b><u>hoist</u></b>	Raise (something) by means of ropes and pulleys. <i><b>Hoist</b> the bicycle onto the roof of the car.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>He climbed the career <b>ladder</b>.</i>
<b>lift</b>	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>He <b>lifted</b> his trophy over his head.</i>

<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<b>precipitate</b>	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>Cell proteins were then <b>precipitated</b> and washed in 10 trichloroacetic acid.</i>
<b>promote</b>	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>They are using famous personalities to <b>promote</b> the library nationally.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>A strain of yeast that would create enough gas to <b>raise</b> the thick bread dough.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise to one s feet. <i>It was here that the brook had its <b>rise</b>.</i>
<b>risen</b>	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	Coming to maturity. <i>A <b>rising</b> young politician.</i>
<b>soar</b>	Fly by means of a hang glider. <i>The dollar <b>soared</b> against the yen.</i>
<b>soaring</b>	Increasing rapidly above the usual level. <i><b>Soaring</b> prices.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>stepladder</b>	A folding portable ladder hinged at the top.
<b>underpin</b>	Support from beneath. <i>The theme of honour <b>underpinning</b> the two books.</i>
<b>uphill</b>	An upward slope. <i>The journey is slightly <b>uphill</b>.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	On or of upper floors of a building. <i>No one was allowed to see the <b>upstairs</b>.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Towards a higher place, point, or level. <i>From childhood <b>upward</b>.</i>
<b>vertically</b>	In a vertical direction. <i><b>Vertically</b> integrated companies.</i>
<b>zoom</b>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The camera <b>zoomed</b> in for a close up of his face.</i>
