causing The act of causing something to happen.

creation (theology) God's act of bringing the universe into existence.

An event that is a beginning; a first part or stage of subsequent events.

She has been on the board since its **inception** two years ago.

The action of beginning something.

initiation An initiation ceremony.

inspiration Arousal of the mind to special unusual activity or creativity.

A rare moment of **inspiration** in an otherwise dull display.

kindling Material for starting a fire.



making

Usually plural the components needed for making or doing something.

The **making** of videos.

The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new.

There are a number of theories on the **origination** of the name.

production The process of or management involved in making a film, play, or record.

Excess **production** of collagen by the liver.

prompting Persuasion formulated as a suggestion.

The audience could hear his **prompting**.

spawning The mass of eggs deposited by fish or amphibians or molluscs.

triggering Lever that activates the firing mechanism of a gun.
