## Cautiously as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Cautiously" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “cautiously” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *As if with kid gloves; with caution or prudence or tact.*
- *In a way that deliberately avoids potential problems or dangers.*
- *In a conservative manner.*

### Synonyms of "Cautiously" as an adverb (3 Words)

<b>carefully</b>	Taking care or paying attention. <i>He listened <b>carefully</b> to the way people spoke.</i>
<b>conservatively</b>	In a sober and conventional way. <i>The frostbite injury was treated <b>conservatively</b>.</i>
<b>guardedly</b>	In a conservative manner.

### Usage Examples of "Cautiously" as an adverb

- *We must proceed cautiously.*
- *Such laws have been cautiously welcomed.*
- *She ventured cautiously downstairs.*

## Associations of "Cautiously" (30 Words)

<b>advised</b>	Having received information. <i>You would be <b>advised</b> to check on increases to your pension.</i>
<b>alert</b>	A warning serves to make you more alert to danger. <i>Traffic was halted during the <b>alert</b>.</i>
<b>attention</b>	A general interest that leads people to want to know more. <i>He turned his <b>attention</b> to the educational system.</i>
<b>attentive</b>	(often followed by `to') giving care or attention. <i>Never before had she had such an <b>attentive</b> audience.</i>
<b>beware</b>	Be cautious and alert to risks or dangers. <i>We should <b>beware</b> the incompetence of legislators.</i>
<b>careful</b>	Unhurried and with care and dignity. <i>I begged him to be more <b>careful</b>.</i>
<b>carefully</b>	Taking care or paying attention. <i>They must be <b>carefully</b> handled and stored.</i>
<b>carefulness</b>	The quality of being careful and painstaking. <i>I admired the <b>carefulness</b> of his work.</i>
<b>caution</b>	Issue an official or legal warning to. <i>Advisers have <b>cautioned</b> against tax increases.</i>
<b>cautious</b>	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>Firms have been unusually <b>cautious</b> about hiring new workers.</i>
<b>chary</b>	Cautiously or suspiciously reluctant to do something. <i>A <b>chary</b> investor.</i>
<b>circumspect</b>	Wary and unwilling to take risks. <i>Physicians are now more <b>circumspect</b> about recommending its use.</i>
<b>consider</b>	Take into consideration for exemplifying purposes. <i>I <b>consider</b> her to be shallow.</i>
<b>contemplate</b>	Consider as a possibility. <i><b>Contemplate</b> one's navel.</i>
<b>deliberate</b>	Discuss the pros and cons of an issue. <i>A conscientious and <b>deliberate</b> worker.</i>
<b>deliberation</b>	Long and careful consideration or discussion. <i>The commission's <b>deliberations</b>.</i>
<b>discreet</b>	Intentionally unobtrusive. <i>A <b>discreet</b> investor.</i>

<b><u>discreetly</u></b>	In a careful and prudent manner, especially in order to keep something confidential or to avoid embarrassment. <i>He <b>discreetly</b> inquired whether the position was still available.</i>
<b>forethought</b>	Planning or plotting in advance of acting. <i>Jim had the <b>forethought</b> to book in advance.</i>
<b>heed</b>	Pay close attention to give heed to. <i>He spends without <b>heed</b> to the consequences.</i>
<b><u>intelligently</u></b>	In a knowledgeable and insightful way; cleverly. <i><b>Intelligently</b> designed products.</i>
<b><u>ponder</u></b>	Think about (something) carefully, especially before making a decision or reaching a conclusion. <i>She sat <b>pondering</b> over her problem.</i>
<b>precaution</b>	A precautionary measure warding off impending danger or damage or injury etc. <i>He put an ice pack on the injury as a <b>precaution</b>.</i>
<b><u>prudent</u></b>	Acting with or showing care and thought for the future. <i><b>Prudent</b> hesitation.</i>
<b>solicitous</b>	Characterized by or showing interest or concern. <i><b>Solicitous</b> about the future.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>He was attentive and <b>thoughtful</b>.</i>
<b><u>thoughtfully</u></b>	With consideration for the needs of other people. <i>The government <b>thoughtfully</b> offered to foot part of the bill.</i>
<b>warning</b>	Serving to warn. <i>A word of <b>warning</b> don t park illegally.</i>
<b>wary</b>	Openly distrustful and unwilling to confide. <i>A <b>wary</b> glance at the black clouds.</i>
<b>watchful</b>	Wakeful; sleepless. <i>They attended dances under the <b>watchful</b> eye of their father.</i>
