### Synonyms of "Ceaseless" as an adjective (8 Words)

<b>constant</b>	Occurring continuously over a period of time. <i>The <b>constant</b> background noise of the city.</i>
<b><a href="#">continual</a></b>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i><b>Continual</b> is often used interchangeably with continuous.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	Forming a series with no exceptions or reversals. <i>A <b>continuous</b> bout of illness lasting six months.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>never-ending</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

<b>perpetual</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Their <b>perpetual</b> money worries.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b><u>unremitting</u></b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i><b>Unremitting</b> demands of hunger.</i>

- *The ceaseless thunder of surf.*

## Associations of "Ceaseless" (30 Words)

<b>changeless</b>	Remaining the same. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>constant</b>	A situation that does not change. <i>The <b>constant</b> background noise of the city.</i>
<b><u>continual</u></b>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>The <b>continual</b> banging of the shutters.</i>
<b><u>continually</u></b>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>
<b>continue</b>	Continue after an interruption. <i>The Archive has <b>continued</b> its programme of research.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	(of a function) of which the graph is a smooth unbroken curve, i.e. one such that as the value of x approaches any given value a, the value of f(x) approaches that of f(a) as a limit. <i>There are <b>continuous</b> advances in design and production.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. <i>Their performance has <b>continuously</b> improved.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Countless; innumerable. <i>An <b>endless</b> chain.</i>
<b><u>eternal</u></b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>The secret of <b>eternal</b> youth.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i><b>Ever</b> busy.</i>

<b>everlasting</b>	Eternity. <i>The damned would suffer <b>everlasting</b> torment.</i>
<b>forever</b>	For a very long or seemingly endless time. <i>We had to wait <b>forever</b> and a day.</i>
<b>grinding</b>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>Vegetable <b>grindings</b> clogged the drain.</i>
<b>immortal</b>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>He will always be one of the <b>immortals</b> of soccer.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>infinite</b>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i><b>Infinite</b> verb form.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.</i>
<b>perennial</b>	A perennial plant. <i>He s a <b>perennial</b> student.</i>
<b>permanent</b>	A perm for the hair. <i><b>Permanent</b> brain damage.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>He grows <b>perpetual</b> flowering carnations.</i>
<b>perpetuity</b>	A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law. <i>He did not believe in the <b>perpetuity</b> of military rule.</i>
<b>timeless</b>	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the <b>timeless</b> atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Not coming to an end; continuous. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b>unchecked</b>	Not examined or checked. <i>An <b>unchecked</b> temper.</i>
<b>undying</b>	Never dying. <i>His <b>undying</b> fame.</i>
<b>uninterrupted</b>	(of a view) unobstructed. <i>A convalescent needs <b>uninterrupted</b> sleep.</i>
