Definitions of "Ceaseless" as an adjective

- *Constant and unending.*
- *Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.*

Synonyms of "Ceaseless" as an adjective (8 Words)

constant	Occurring continuously over a period of time. <i>The constant background noise of the city.</i>
continual	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>Continual is often used interchangeably with <i>continuous</i>.</i>
continuous	Forming a series with no exceptions or reversals. <i>A continuous bout of illness lasting six months.</i>
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
never-ending	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Their perpetual money worries.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
unremitting	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Unremitting demands of hunger.</i>

Usage Examples of "Ceaseless" as an adjective

- *The fort was subjected to ceaseless bombardment.*
- *The ceaseless thunder of surf.*

Associations of "Ceaseless" (30 Words)

changeless	Remaining the same. <i>Changeless truths.</i>
constant	A situation that does not change. <i>The constant background noise of the city.</i>
continual	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>The continual banging of the shutters.</i>
continually	Without interruption; constantly. <i>I was continually moving around.</i>
continue	Continue after an interruption. <i>The Archive has continued its programme of research.</i>
continuous	(of a function) of which the graph is a smooth unbroken curve, i.e. one such that as the value of x approaches any given value a, the value of f(x) approaches that of f(a) as a limit. <i>There are continuous advances in design and production.</i>
continuously	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. <i>Their performance has continuously improved.</i>
endless	Countless; innumerable. <i>An endless chain.</i>
eternal	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>The secret of eternal youth.</i>
ever	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Ever busy.</i>

everlasting	Eternity. <i>The damned would suffer everlasting torment.</i>
forever	For a very long or seemingly endless time. <i>We had to wait forever and a day.</i>
grinding	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>Vegetable grindings clogged the drain.</i>
immortal	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>He will always be one of the immortals of soccer.</i>
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
infinite	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>Infinite verb form.</i>
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>We got bogged down in interminable discussions.</i>
perennial	A perennial plant. <i>He s a perennial student.</i>
permanent	A perm for the hair. <i>Permanent brain damage.</i>
perpetual	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>He grows perpetual flowering carnations.</i>
perpetuity	A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
timeless	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
unceasing	Not coming to an end; continuous. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
unchecked	Not examined or checked. <i>An unchecked temper.</i>
undying	Never dying. <i>His undying fame.</i>
uninterrupted	(of a view) unobstructed. <i>A convalescent needs uninterrupted sleep.</i>
