perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. Their perpetual money worries.
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
<u>unremitting</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. Unremitting demands of hunger.

continuous	(of a function) of which the graph is a smooth unbroken curve, i.e. one such that as the value of x approaches any given value a, the value of f(x) approaches that of f(a) as a limit. <i>There are continuous</i> advances in design and production.
continuously	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. Their performance has continuously improved.
endless	Countless; innumerable. An endless chain.
<u>eternal</u>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. The secret of eternal youth.
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Ever</i> busy.

For a very long or seemingly endless time. We had to wait forever and a day.
A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>Vegetable grindings clogged the drain.</i>
An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>He will always be one of the immortals of soccer.</i>
(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.
Without interruption. She talked about him incessantly .
A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>Infinite</i> verb form.
Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. We got bogged down in interminable discussions.
A perennial plant. He s a perennial student.
A perm for the hair. Permanent brain damage.
(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>He grows perpetual flowering carnations.</i>
A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.
Not coming to an end; continuous. The unceasing efforts of the staff.
With unflagging resolve.
Not examined or checked. An unchecked temper.
Never dying. His undying fame.
(of a view) unobstructed. A convalescent needs uninterrupted sleep.

<u>unremitting</u>	Never relaxing or slackening; incessant. Unremitting drizzle.
