<b>holy</b>	Morally and spiritually excellent. <i><b>Holy</b> smoke.</i>
<b>in space</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>in the heavens</b>	Holding office.
<b>in the sky</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>planetary</b>	Relating to the earth as a planet. <i><b>Planetary</b> rumblings and eructations.</i>
<b>saintly</b>	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A crypt for some <b>saintly</b> relic.</i>
<b><u>spiritual</u></b>	Lacking material body or form or substance. <i><b>Spiritual</b>appings at a seance.</i>
<b><u>stellar</u></b>	Featuring or having the quality of a star performer or performers. <i>A <b>stellar</b> performance.</i>
<b>superlunary</b>	Situated beyond the moon or its orbit around the earth.
<b>supernal</b>	Of heaven or the spirit. <i>He is the <b>supernal</b> poet of our age.</i>

<b>aurora</b>	A natural electrical phenomenon characterized by the appearance of streamers of reddish or greenish light in the sky especially near the northern or southern magnetic pole The effect is caused by the interaction of charged particles from the sun with atoms in the upper atmosphere In northern and southern regions it is respectively called aurora borealis or Northern Lights and aurora australis or Southern Lights.
<b>azure</b>	Color azure. <i>Morning <b>azure</b> the village.</i>
<b>beatific</b>	Imparting holy bliss. <i>A <b>beatific</b> smile.</i>
<b>blue</b>	Blue clothes or material. <i>A <b>blue</b> silk shirt.</i>
<b>brighten</b>	Make or become happier and more cheerful. <i>The paint will <b>brighten</b> the room.</i>
<b>comet</b>	A relatively small extraterrestrial body consisting of a frozen mass that travels around the sun in a highly elliptical orbit.
<b>cosmic</b>	Inconceivably extended in space or time. <i><b>Cosmic</b> matter.</i>
<b>divine</b>	Resulting from divine providence. <i>The <b>divine</b> capacity for love.</i>
<b>dome</b>	A sports stadium with a domed roof. <i>The <b>dome</b> of St Paul s Cathedral.</i>
<b>elysian</b>	Being of such surpassing excellence as to suggest inspiration by the gods. <i>An <b>elysian</b> meal.</i>
<b>ethereal</b>	(of a solution) having diethyl ether as a solvent. <i><b>Ethereal</b> solution.</i>
<b>firmament</b>	The heavens or sky. <i>Thunder shakes the <b>firmament</b>.</i>
<b>heaven</b>	The sky, especially perceived as a vault in which the sun, moon, stars, and planets are situated. <i>Galileo used a telescope to observe the <b>heavens</b>.</i>
<b>heavenly</b>	Very pleasing; wonderful. <i>A <b>heavenly</b> body.</i>
<b>hemisphere</b>	A half of the earth, usually as divided into northern and southern halves by the equator, or into western and eastern halves by an imaginary line passing through the poles. <i>The left <b>hemisphere</b> plays a dominant role in the comprehension of language.</i>

<b>latitude</b>	Scope for freedom of action or thought. <i>Temperate <b>latitudes</b>.</i>
<b>meteor</b>	A streak of light in the sky at night that results when a meteoroid hits the earth's atmosphere and air friction causes the meteoroid to melt or vaporize or explode.
<b>meteorite</b>	A piece of rock or metal that has fallen to the earth's surface from outer space as a meteor. Over 90 per cent of meteorites are of rock while the remainder consist wholly or partly of iron and nickel.
<b>paradise</b>	An ideal or idyllic place or state. <i>My idea of <b>paradise</b> is to relax on the seafront.</i>
<b>planet</b>	Astronomy any of the nine large celestial bodies in the solar system that revolve around the sun and shine by reflected light: Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune, and Pluto, in order of their proximity to the sun, viewed from the constellation Hercules. All the planets rotate around the sun in a counterclockwise direction. <i>No generation has the right to pollute the <b>planet</b>.</i>
<b>rainbow</b>	An arch of colours visible in the sky caused by the refraction and dispersion of the sun's light by rain or other water droplets in the atmosphere. The colours of the rainbow are generally said to be red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, and violet. <i>A big <b>rainbow</b> packet of felt pens.</i>
<b>sacred</b>	(often followed by 'to') devoted exclusively to a single use or purpose or person. <i>A morning hour <b>sacred</b> to study.</i>
<b>saintly</b>	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A crypt for some <b>saintly</b> relic.</i>
<b>saturn</b>	God of agriculture and vegetation; counterpart of Greek Cronus.
<b>seraphic</b>	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>He imagined a <b>seraphic</b> presence in the room.</i>
<b>sky</b>	Throw or toss with a light motion. <i>Dorcas had never seen so much <b>sky</b>.</i>
<b>stratosphere</b>	The very highest levels of something. <i>Her next big campaign launched her into the fashion <b>stratosphere</b>.</i>
<b>supernal</b>	Of heaven or the spirit. <i>He is the <b>supernal</b> poet of our age.</i>
<b>welkin</b>	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected.
