- Concrete pavement is sometimes referred to as cement.
- A substance for filling cavities in teeth.
- Any of various materials used by dentists to fill cavities in teeth.
- A specialized bony substance covering the root of a tooth.
- A thin layer of bony material that fixes teeth to the jaw.
- The material which binds particles together in sedimentary rock.
- A factor or element that unites a group of people.




