- *A soft glue that hardens on setting.*
- *A building material that is a powder made of a mixture of calcined limestone and clay; used with water and sand or gravel to make concrete and mortar.*
- *Concrete pavement is sometimes referred to as cement.*
- *A substance for filling cavities in teeth.*
- *Any of various materials used by dentists to fill cavities in teeth.*
- *A specialized bony substance covering the root of a tooth.*
- *A thin layer of bony material that fixes teeth to the jaw.*
- *The material which binds particles together in sedimentary rock.*
- *A factor or element that unites a group of people.*

- *Something that hardens to act as adhesive material.*

- fixative** A chemical substance used to preserve or stabilize biological material prior to microscopy or other examination.

gum A gum tree especially a eucalyptus.

paste A paste used as an adhesive especially for sticking paper.

sealant A kind of sealing material that is used to form a hard coating on a porous surface (as a coat of paint or varnish used to size a surface).
Blobs of silicone sealant.

sealer A jar with a hermetic seal designed to preserve food such as fruit, pickles, and jams.
A vacuum sealer extends the time wine remains drinkable.

Definitions of "Cement" as a verb

- *Cover or coat with cement.*
- *Bind or join with or as if with cement.*
- *(of a material) bind (particles) together in sedimentary rock.*
- *Make fast as if with cement.*
- *Fix with cement.*
- *Settle or establish firmly.*

- bond** Issue bonds on.
*Press the material to **bond** the layers together.*
- connect** Make a logical or causal connection.
*I was quickly **connected** to the police.*
- join** Be or become joined or united or linked.
*Our paths **joined**.*
- stick** Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist separation.
***Stick** the poster onto the wall.*

calcareous	Containing calcium carbonate; chalky. <i>The bottom mud becomes calcareous.</i>
calcite	A common mineral consisting of crystallized calcium carbonate; a major constituent of limestone.
calcium	A white metallic element that burns with a brilliant light; the fifth most abundant element in the earth's crust; an important component of most plants and animals.
caryatid	A supporting column carved in the shape of a person.
concrete	Cover an area with concrete. <i>The precious English countryside may soon be concreted over.</i>
crystal	A crystalline piece of semiconductor used as an oscillator or transducer. <i>A crystal chandelier.</i>
effigy	A roughly made model of a person that is made in order to be damaged or destroyed as a protest. <i>A tomb effigy of Eleanor of Aquitaine.</i>
granite	Something having the quality of granite unyielding firmness. <i>A man of granite.</i>
gypsum	A soft white or grey mineral consisting of hydrated calcium sulphate. It occurs chiefly in sedimentary deposits and is used to make plaster of Paris and fertilizers, and in the building industry.
harden	Cause to accept or become hardened to habituate. <i>Brick is made of moist clay hardened by heat.</i>
lime	Birdlime. <i>The oak had to be limed then waxed and then brushed to get that particular effect.</i>
limestone	A sedimentary rock consisting mainly of calcium that was deposited by the remains of marine animals.
marble	Stain or streak something so that it looks like marble. <i>Marble paper.</i>
mud	Plaster with mud. <i>The two sides took over the local media to throw mud at each other.</i>
plaster	Coat with plaster. <i>A large piece of plaster on her forehead.</i>
porphyry	Any igneous rock with crystals embedded in a finer groundmass of minerals.
quartz	A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.

rock A mass of rock projecting above the earth's surface or out of the sea.
*There are dangerous **rocks** around the island.*

sand Smooth or polish with sandpaper or a mechanical sander.
*This magical coast boasts mile upon mile of golden **sand**.*

sculpt Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material.
*She is **sculpting** the block of marble into an image of her husband.*

sculpture A work of art made by sculpture.
*A bronze **sculpture**.*

silicon The chemical element of atomic number 14 a non metal with semiconducting properties used in making electronic circuits Pure silicon exists in a shiny dark grey crystalline form and as an amorphous powder.

slate Cover with slate.
*Construction is **slated** to begin late next year.*

stone A round piece or counter originally made of stone used in various board games especially the Japanese game of go.
*People wanted to **stone** the woman who had a child out of wedlock.*
