Associations of "Cemented" (30 Words)

adobe	A building constructed from adobe clay or bricks. <i>Adobe houses.</i>
alabaster	Of or resembling alabaster. <i>Alabaster statue.</i>
amethyst	A precious stone consisting of a violet or purple variety of quartz. <i>A delicate necklace of amethysts and pearls.</i>
asphalt	The pitch used in asphalt sometimes found in natural deposits but usually made by the distillation of crude oil. <i>Asphalt the driveway.</i>
brick	Block or enclose with a wall of bricks. <i>This mill was built of brick.</i>
build	Be engaged in building. <i>The county council plans to build a bypass.</i>
calcareous	Containing calcium carbonate; chalky. <i>The bottom mud becomes calcareous.</i>
calcite	A common mineral consisting of crystallized calcium carbonate; a major constituent of limestone.
calcium	The chemical element of atomic number 20, a soft grey metal.
caryatid	A stone carving of a draped female figure, used as a pillar to support the entablature of a Greek or Greek-style building.
concrete	Fix in position with concrete. <i>Concrete the walls.</i>
crystal	A crystalline piece of semiconductor used as an oscillator or transducer. <i>Ice crystals formed where his breath froze.</i>
effigy	A roughly made model of a person that is made in order to be damaged or destroyed as a protest. <i>A tomb effigy of Eleanor of Aquitaine.</i>

granite	Something having the quality of granite unyielding firmness. <i>A man of granite.</i>
gypsum	A soft white or grey mineral consisting of hydrated calcium sulphate. It occurs chiefly in sedimentary deposits and is used to make plaster of Paris and fertilizers, and in the building industry.
harden	Harden by reheating and cooling in oil. <i>She hardened her heart.</i>
lime	A white caustic alkaline substance consisting of calcium oxide which is obtained by heating limestone and which combines with water with the production of much heat quicklime. <i>The oak had to be limed then waxed and then brushed to get that particular effect.</i>
limestone	A hard sedimentary rock, composed mainly of calcium carbonate or dolomite, used as building material and in the making of cement.
marble	Stain or streak something so that it looks like marble. <i>I thought she'd lost her marbles asking a question like that.</i>
mud	Soil with mud muck or mire. <i>Ankle deep in mud we squelched across a meadow.</i>
plaster	The powder from which plaster of Paris is made. <i>Plaster the broken arm.</i>
porphyry	A hard igneous rock containing crystals of feldspar in a fine-grained groundmass.
quartz	A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.
rock	A large piece of rock which has become detached from a cliff or mountain a boulder. <i>A piece of rock.</i>
sand	A stratum of sandstone or compacted sand. <i>Mask off the area to be painted and sand it down.</i>
sculpt	Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material. <i>Sculpting human figures from ivory.</i>
sculpture	Form or shape as if by sculpture especially with strong smooth curves. <i>Ammonite shells with external sculpture near the aperture.</i>
silicon	The chemical element of atomic number 14 a non metal with semiconducting properties used in making electronic circuits Pure silicon exists in a shiny dark grey crystalline form and as an amorphous powder.

slate

Formerly a writing tablet made of slate.

stone

A piece of stone shaped for a purpose especially one of commemoration ceremony or demarcation.

*Isabel stood as if turned to **stone**.*
