egotist seeker.

grasping Avaricious; greedy.

Grasping commercialism.

Intense and selfish desire for something, especially wealth, power, or food.

Greed has taken over football.

grumpy Annoyed and irritable.

He s **grumpy** because he hasn t heard from you.

haughtiness Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors.

Her air of **haughtiness**.

hedonism The pursuit of pleasure as a matter of ethical principle.

(in Greek tragedy) excessive pride towards or defiance of the gods, leading

hubris to nemesis.

The self assured **hubris** among economists was shaken in the late 1980s.

independent An independent person or body.

Independent television.

individualist A person who pursues independent thought or action.

Individualist capitalism.

individualistic More interested in individual people than in society as a whole.

Her work is quirky and genuinely **individualistic**.

narcissism Selfishness, involving a sense of entitlement, a lack of empathy, and a need

for admiration, as characterizing a personality type.

A possessive word or form.

possessive Word of form.

He placed a firm **possessive** hand on her elbow.

A feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's own

pride achievements, the achievements of those with whom one is closely associated, or from qualities or possessions that are widely admired.
