## Associations of "Centered" (30 Words)

<b>arbitrarily</b>	Without restraint in the use of authority; autocratically. <i>Recurrent infection is <b>arbitrarily</b> defined as three or more infections a year.</i>
<b><u>center</u></b>	The person who plays center on a basketball team. <i>It is in the <b>center</b> of town.</i>
<b>clannish</b>	Befitting or characteristic of those who incline to social exclusiveness and who rebuff the advances of people considered inferior. <i><b>Clannish</b> loyalty.</i>
<b>conceit</b>	The trait of being unduly vain and conceited false pride. <i>The architect s brilliant <b>conceit</b> was to build the house around the tree.</i>
<b>conceited</b>	Excessively proud of oneself; vain. <i>An attitude of self <b>conceited</b> arrogance.</i>
<b>covetousness</b>	Reprehensible acquisitiveness; insatiable desire for wealth (personified as one of the deadly sins).
<b><u>ego</u></b>	A person’s sense of self-esteem or self-importance. <i>He needed a boost to his <b>ego</b>.</i>
<b><u>egocentric</u></b>	An egocentric person. <i><b>Egocentric</b> spatial perception.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	An ethical theory that treats self-interest as the foundation of morality.
<b>egoist</b>	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
<b>egotism</b>	The fact of being excessively conceited or absorbed in oneself. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A person who is excessively conceited or absorbed in themselves; a self-seeker. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>

<b>grasping</b>	Avaricious; greedy. <b>Grasping</b> commercialism.
<b>greed</b>	Intense and selfish desire for something, especially wealth, power, or food. <b>Greed</b> has taken over football.
<b>grumpy</b>	Annoyed and irritable. He s <b>grumpy</b> because he hasn t heard from you.
<b>haughtiness</b>	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. Her air of <b>haughtiness</b> .
<b>hedonism</b>	The pursuit of pleasure as a matter of ethical principle.
<b>hubris</b>	(in Greek tragedy) excessive pride towards or defiance of the gods, leading to nemesis. The self assured <b>hubris</b> among economists was shaken in the late 1980s.
<b>independent</b>	An independent person or body. <b>Independent</b> television.
<b>individualist</b>	A person who pursues independent thought or action. <b>Individualist</b> capitalism.
<b>individualistic</b>	More interested in individual people than in society as a whole. Her work is quirky and genuinely <b>individualistic</b> .
<b>narcissism</b>	Selfishness, involving a sense of entitlement, a lack of empathy, and a need for admiration, as characterizing a personality type.
<b>possessive</b>	A possessive word or form. He placed a firm <b>possessive</b> hand on her elbow.
<b>pride</b>	A feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's own achievements, the achievements of those with whom one is closely associated, or from qualities or possessions that are widely admired. I went to <b>pride</b> as a teenager before I was ready to come out.
<b>self</b>	Self pollinate self fertilize. To love in an unpossessive way implies the total surrender of <b>self</b> .
<b>selfish</b>	(of a person, action, or motive) lacking consideration for other people; concerned chiefly with one's own personal profit or pleasure. I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.
<b>selfishness</b>	Stinginess resulting from a concern for your own welfare and a disregard of others. An act of pure <b>selfishness</b> .
<b>stingy</b>	Unwilling to spend. She practices economy without being <b>stingy</b> .
