chief	A person who is in charge. <i>The chief aim of living.</i>
civic	Of or relating or belonging to a city. <i>A meeting of civic and business leaders.</i>
concentration	Strengthening the concentration as of a solute in a mixture by removing diluting material. <i>Concentration on the needs of the young can mean that the elderly are forgotten.</i>
concentric	Of or denoting circles, arcs, or other shapes which share the same centre, the larger often completely surrounding the smaller. <i>A universe consisting of concentric spheres or layers.</i>
core	Remove the core or center from. <i>Bronzes that have been cast using a clay core.</i>
crucial	Having crucial relevance. <i>A crucial moment in his career.</i>
egoism	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
focal	Relating to the centre or most important part. <i>Focal infection.</i>
focus	Place the focus on an element of a sentence. <i>Please focus the image we cannot enjoy the movie.</i>
fulcrum	The point against which a lever is placed to get a purchase, or on which it turns or is supported. <i>Research is the fulcrum of the academic community.</i>
halfway	In the middle of a period of time. <i>Halfway measures.</i>
hub	A center of activity or interest or commerce or transportation; a focal point around which events revolve. <i>The airport is the economic hub of the area.</i>
instrumental	A noun in the instrumental case. <i>A largely instrumental piece.</i>
interim	An interim dividend profit etc. <i>An interim agreement.</i>
intermediate	A person at an intermediate level of knowledge or skill. <i>Intermediate capacity.</i>
main	Most important element. <i>A main road.</i>

meantime	Meanwhile. <i>Meantime he was attentive to his other interests.</i>
mid	Of or in the middle part or position of a range. <i>A mid central vowel.</i>
middle	In cricket tennis etc strike the ball with the middle of the bat racket or club. <i>The middle of the war.</i>
middlebrow	A middlebrow person. <i>Middlebrow fiction.</i>
midway	Naval battle of World War II (June 1942); American planes based on land and on carriers decisively defeated a Japanese fleet on its way to invade the Midway Islands. <i>The kids head straight for the midway.</i>
neuter	A neuter word. <i>The conquering hero is a neuter.</i>
neutral	An electrically neutral point terminal conductor or wire. <i>Neutral and non aligned European nations.</i>
pivot	Provide a mechanism with a pivot fix a mechanism on a pivot. <i>He swung round pivoting on his heel.</i>
pivotal	Being of crucial importance. <i>Its pivotal location has also exposed it to periodic invasions.</i>
point	Extend the toes or feet in line with the leg by tensing the foot and ankle in such a way as to form a point. <i>A row of points.</i>
proximal	Situated nearer to the centre of the body or the point of attachment. <i>The proximal end of the forearm.</i>
