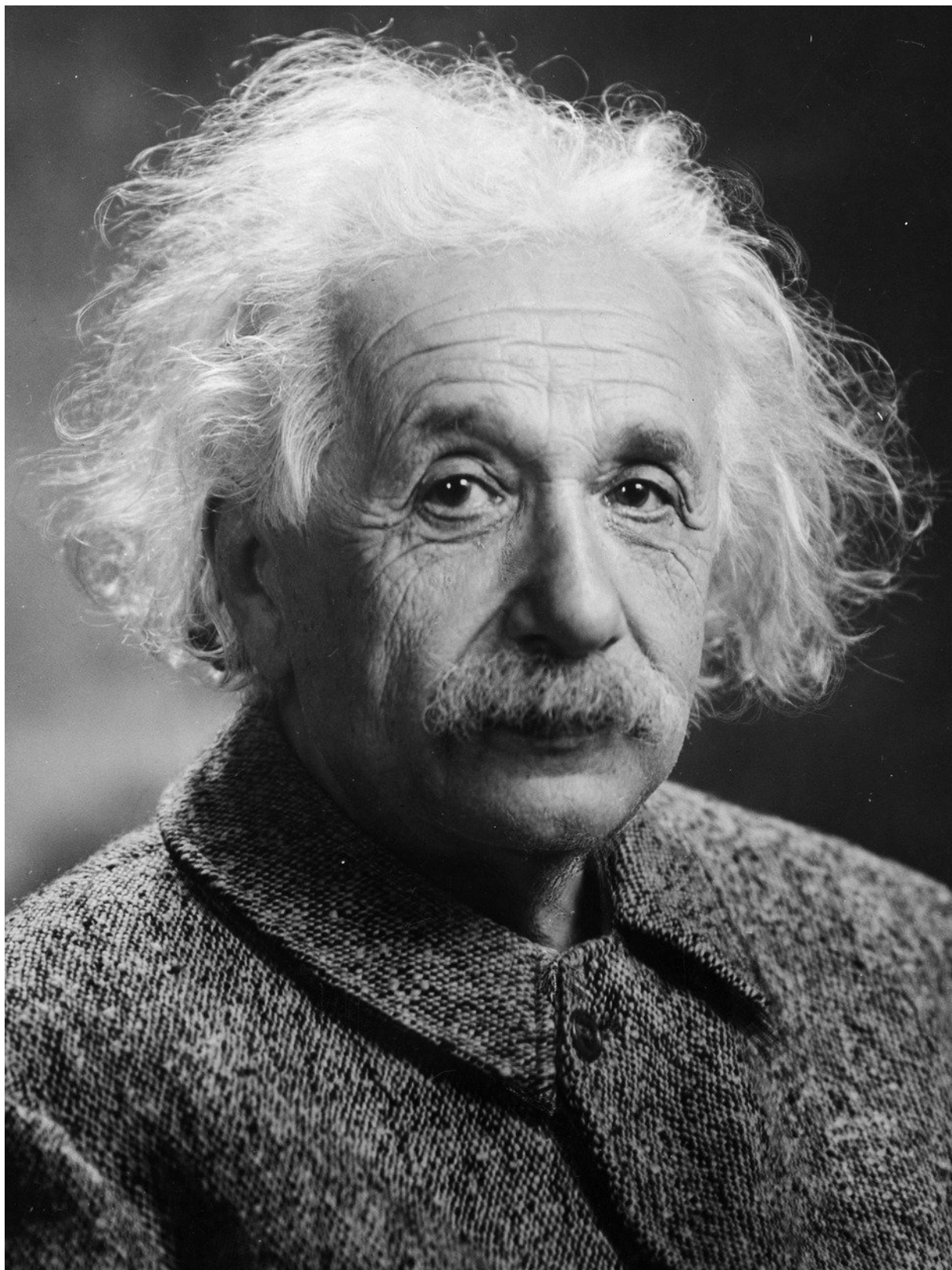

Definitions of "Century" as a noun

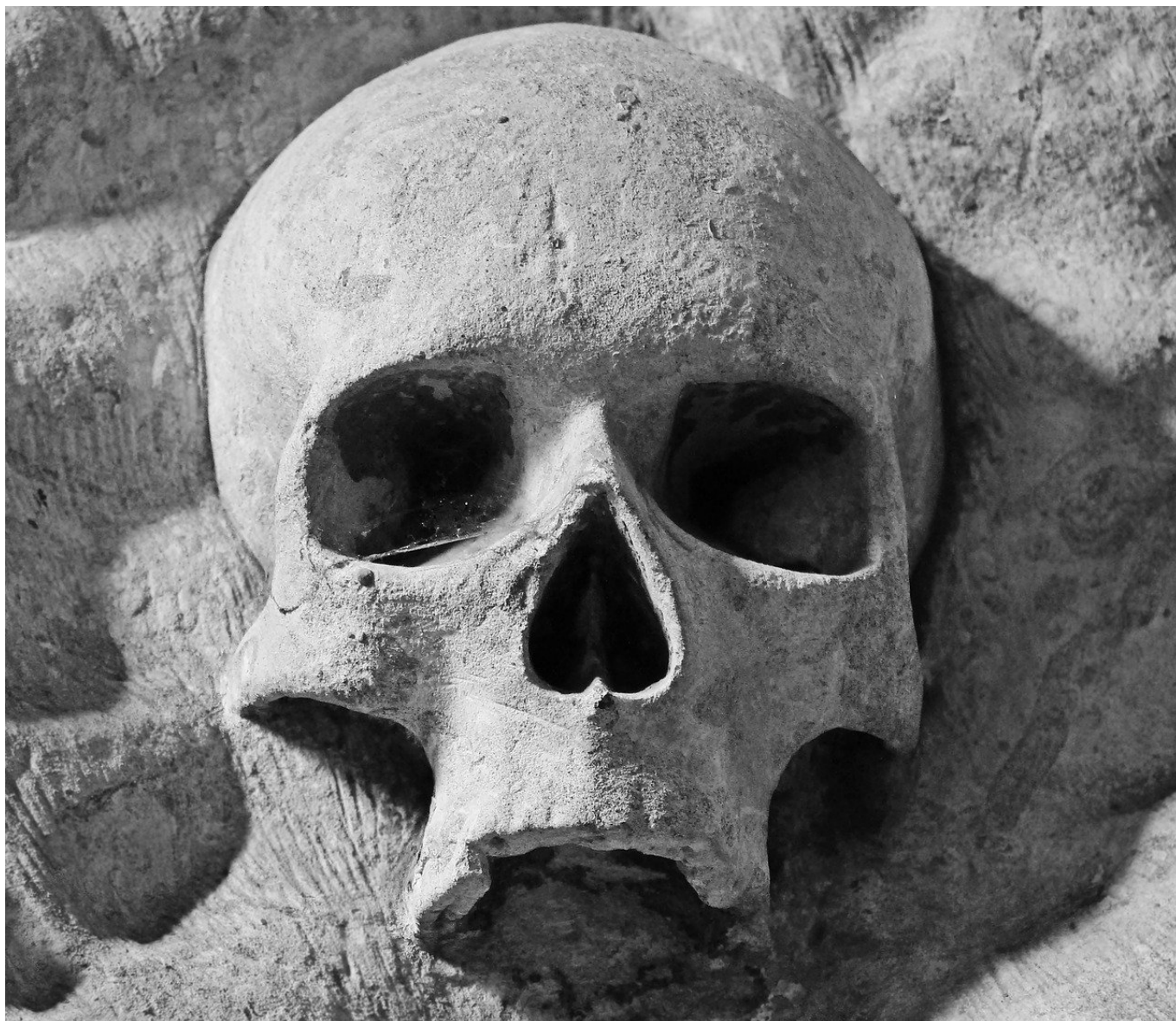
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “century” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A company in the ancient Roman army, originally of a hundred men.*
- *A period of 100 years.*
- *A period of one hundred years.*
- *A period of a hundred years reckoned from the traditional date of the birth of Christ.*
- *Ten 10s.*
- *An ancient Roman political division for voting.*
- *A score of a hundred in a sporting event, especially a batsman's score of a hundred runs in cricket.*



Synonyms of "Century" as a noun (12 Words)

100	Ten 10s.
age	A particular stage in someone's life. <i>We live in a litigious age.</i>
c	Music the keynote of the scale of C major.
<u>decade</u>	Each of the five divisions of each chapter of the rosary. <i>The fourth decade of the nineteenth century.</i>
epoch	A particular period of time in history or a person's life. <i>The Victorian epoch.</i>
<u>era</u>	A measure of a pitcher's effectiveness calculated as the average number of earned runs allowed by the pitcher for every nine innings pitched. <i>His death marked the end of an era.</i>
hundred	Ten 10s. <i>Wantage Hundred.</i>
one c	The smallest whole number or a numeral representing this number.
period	A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table. <i>The training period is between 16 and 18 months.</i>
<u>stage</u>	The theater as a profession usually the stage. <i>It set the stage for peaceful negotiations.</i>
time	Time or an amount of time as reckoned by a conventional standard. <i>I didn't have time to finish.</i>
<u>year</u>	A period similar to a year used for reckoning time according to other calendars. <i>She is 4 years old.</i>

- *The fifteenth century.*
- *A century ago most people walked to work.*



Associations of "Century" (30 Words)

<u>annual</u>	An annual plant. <i>The sponsored walk became an annual event.</i>
antediluvian	Of or relating to the period before the biblical flood. <i>Gigantic bones of antediluvian animals.</i>
antiquary	An expert or collector of antiquities.
<u>antiquated</u>	Old-fashioned or outdated. <i>This antiquated central heating system.</i>
<u>archaic</u>	(of a word or a style of language) no longer in everyday use but sometimes used to impart an old-fashioned flavour. <i>Prisons are run on archaic methods.</i>
billion	Denoting a quantity consisting of one million million items or units in Great Britain.

<u>decade</u>	A range of electrical resistances, frequencies, or other quantities spanning from one to ten times a base value. <i>The fourth decade of the nineteenth century.</i>
eighty	The cardinal number that is the product of ten and eight.
eleven	Being one more than ten.
fifty	A United States bill worth 50 dollars.
five	A playing card or a domino or a die whose upward face shows five pips.
fourth	In the fourth place. <i>Fourthly you must pay the rent on the first of the month.</i>
<u>half</u>	A half price fare or ticket especially for a child. <i>Half an hour.</i>
hundred	A subdivision of a county or shire, having its own court. <i>Wantage Hundred.</i>
manor	(in North America) an estate or district leased to tenants, especially one granted by royal charter in a British colony or by the Dutch governors of what is now New York State. <i>A Tudor manor house in the English countryside.</i>
millennium	(New Testament) in Revelations it is foretold that those faithful to Jesus will reign with Jesus over the earth for a thousand years; the meaning of these words have been much debated; some denominations (e.g. Jehovah's Witnesses) expect it to be a thousand years of justice and peace and happiness. <i>The millennium of the Russian Orthodox Church.</i>
million	A very large indefinite number (usually hyperbole). <i>There were millions of flies.</i>
nineteen	The cardinal number that is the sum of eighteen and one.
ninety	Being ten more than eighty.
percent	A proportion in relation to a whole (which is usually the amount per hundred).
quarter	Cut a log into quarters and these into planks so as to show the grain well. <i>She cut each apple into quarters.</i>
seventy	The cardinal number that is the product of ten and seven.
sixty	Being ten more than fifty.
<u>span</u>	The wingspan of an aircraft or a bird. <i>A major setback was the collapse of one span of a flyover.</i>
ten	One of four playing cards in a deck with ten pips on the face.
thirteen	Being one more than twelve.

thirty

Being ten more than twenty.

thousand

Denoting a quantity consisting of 1,000 items or units.

twelve

The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one.

twenty

A United States bill worth 20 dollars.
