Definitions of "Certainly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “certainly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Used to express complete agreement with something that has just been said.*
- *Used to emphasize the speaker's belief that what is said is true.*
- *Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’).*
- *Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another.*

absolutely	Not viewed in relation to other things. <i>White collar crime increased both absolutely and in comparison with other categories.</i>
admittedly	Used to express a concession or recognition that something is the case. <i>Admittedly the salary was not wonderful.</i>
assuredly	Without a doubt. <i>Potted roses will most assuredly not survive winter without protection.</i>
beyond doubt	In addition.
beyond question	In addition.
by all means	So as to pass a given point.
clearly	Without doubt or question. <i>On white paper the seeds are clearly visible.</i>

conclusively	In a decisive way that has the effect of proving a case. <i>The story had been conclusively debunked.</i>
definitely	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>I shall definitely be at the airport to meet you.</i>
evidently	In a way that is clearly seen or understood; obviously. <i>A work so evidently laden with significance.</i>
for sure	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely.
incontrovertibly	In an obvious and provable manner.
indeed	Used to introduce a further and stronger or more surprising point. <i>A ghost indeed I've never heard anything so silly.</i>
indisputably	In a way that cannot be challenged or denied. <i>Heart disease has been indisputably linked to smoking.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>Indubitably liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
manifestly	In a way that is clear or obvious to the eye or mind. <i>The system was manifestly unfair.</i>
naturally	By nature. <i>A naturally bright pupil.</i>
obviously	Unmistakably ('plain' is often used informally for 'plainly'). <i>The answer is obviously wrong.</i>
of course	As might be expected.
palpably	Noticeably or clearly. <i>Palpably false claims.</i>
patently	Clearly; without doubt. <i>It is all patently nonsense.</i>
plainly	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>To speak plainly I suffer from a lack of confidence.</i>
positively	So as to be positive; in a positive manner. <i>It's time I got down to thinking positively about this show.</i>
quite	To a certain or fairly significant extent or degree; fairly. <i>Quite rich.</i>
sure	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>They sure smell good.</i>
sure as shooting	Definitely or positively ('sure' is sometimes used informally for 'surely').
sure enough	Definitely or positively ('sure' is sometimes used informally for 'surely').

surely	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>If there is no will then surely the house goes automatically to you.</i>
transparently	(with reference to a process) without the user being aware. <i>She transparently articulates the thought process she goes through.</i>
undeniably	Used to emphasize that something cannot be denied or disputed. <i>Undeniably she gives the performance of her life.</i>
undisputedly	In an unarguable and undisputed manner. <i>He is undisputedly the fastest player in Europe.</i>
undoubtedly	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are undoubtedly guilty.</i>
unequivocally	In an unambiguous manner. <i>We unequivocally condemn any violence in the protest.</i>
unmistakably	In a way that cannot be mistaken for anything else. <i>The music sounds unmistakably English.</i>
unquestionably	In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question. <i>The awards were unquestionably deserved.</i>

accurately	In a way that is correct in all details; exactly. <i>Every single vote was accurately counted.</i>
apparent	Clearly visible or understood; obvious. <i>It became apparent that he was talented.</i>
assured	Protected against discontinuance or change. <i>An extremely assured performance.</i>
assuredly	Used to express the speaker's certainty that something is true. <i>Potted roses will most assuredly not survive winter without protection.</i>

doubtless	Presumably or very probably. <i>The company would doubtless find the reduced competition to their liking.</i>
evidently	In a way that is clearly seen or understood; obviously. <i>She was in bed and evidently in great pain.</i>
expressly	With specific intentions; for the express purpose. <i>The house was expressly built for entertaining.</i>
indeed	Expressing interest of an ironic kind with repetition of a question just asked. <i>She should have no trouble hearing him No indeed.</i>
indubitable	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. <i>An indubitable truth.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>It was immediately and indubitably apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>
justified	Having words so spaced that lines have straight even margins. <i>The doctors were justified in treating her.</i>
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.</i>
obviously	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i>Obviously everyone has to do what they think is right.</i>
outweigh	Be heavier, greater, or more significant than. <i>These considerations outweigh our wishes.</i>
sure	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>A sure footing.</i>

truly	With sincerity; without pretense. <i>It is truly a privilege to be here.</i>
