## Certainly as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Certainly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “certainly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Used to express complete agreement with something that has just been said.*
- *Used to emphasize the speaker's belief that what is said is true.*
- *Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’).*
- *Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another.*



## Synonyms of "Certainly" as an adverb (35 Words)

<b>absolutely</b>	Not viewed in relation to other things. <i>White collar crime increased both <b>absolutely</b> and in comparison with other categories.</i>
<b>admittedly</b>	Used to express a concession or recognition that something is the case. <i><b>Admittedly</b> the salary was not wonderful.</i>
<b>assuredly</b>	Without a doubt. <i>Potted roses will most <b>assuredly</b> not survive winter without protection.</i>
<b>beyond doubt</b>	In addition.
<b>beyond question</b>	In addition.
<b>by all means</b>	So as to pass a given point.
<b>clearly</b>	Without doubt or question. <i>On white paper the seeds are <b>clearly</b> visible.</i>

<b>conclusively</b>	In a decisive way that has the effect of proving a case. <i>The story had been <b>conclusively</b> debunked.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>I shall <b>definitely</b> be at the airport to meet you.</i>
<b>evidently</b>	In a way that is clearly seen or understood; obviously. <i>A work so <b>evidently</b> laden with significance.</i>
<b>for sure</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely.
<b>incontrovertibly</b>	In an obvious and provable manner.
<b>indeed</b>	Used to introduce a further and stronger or more surprising point. <i>A ghost <b>indeed</b> I've never heard anything so silly.</i>
<b>indisputably</b>	In a way that cannot be challenged or denied. <i>Heart disease has been <b>indisputably</b> linked to smoking.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i><b>Indubitably</b> liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
<b>manifestly</b>	In a way that is clear or obvious to the eye or mind. <i>The system was <b>manifestly</b> unfair.</i>
<b>naturally</b>	By nature. <i>A <b>naturally</b> bright pupil.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	Unmistakably ('plain' is often used informally for 'plainly'). <i>The answer is <b>obviously</b> wrong.</i>
<b>of course</b>	As might be expected.
<b>palpably</b>	Noticeably or clearly. <i><b>Palpably</b> false claims.</i>
<b>patently</b>	Clearly; without doubt. <i>It is all <b>patently</b> nonsense.</i>
<b>plainly</b>	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>To speak <b>plainly</b> I suffer from a lack of confidence.</i>
<b>positively</b>	So as to be positive; in a positive manner. <i>It's time I got down to thinking <b>positively</b> about this show.</i>
<b>quite</b>	To a certain or fairly significant extent or degree; fairly. <i><b>Quite</b> rich.</i>
<b>sure</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>They <b>sure</b> smell good.</i>
<b>sure as shooting</b>	Definitely or positively ('sure' is sometimes used informally for 'surely').
<b>sure enough</b>	Definitely or positively ('sure' is sometimes used informally for 'surely').

<b>surely</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>If there is no will then <b>surely</b> the house goes automatically to you.</i>
<b>transparently</b>	(with reference to a process) without the user being aware. <i>She <b>transparently</b> articulates the thought process she goes through.</i>
<b>undeniably</b>	Used to emphasize that something cannot be denied or disputed. <i><b>Undeniably</b> she gives the performance of her life.</i>
<b>undisputedly</b>	In an unarguable and undisputed manner. <i>He is <b>undisputedly</b> the fastest player in Europe.</i>
<b>undoubtedly</b>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are <b>undoubtedly</b> guilty.</i>
<b>unequivocally</b>	In an unambiguous manner. <i>We <b>unequivocally</b> condemn any violence in the protest.</i>
<b>unmistakably</b>	In a way that cannot be mistaken for anything else. <i>The music sounds <b>unmistakably</b> English.</i>
<b>unquestionably</b>	In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question. <i>The awards were <b>unquestionably</b> deserved.</i>

<b>accurately</b>	In a way that is correct in all details; exactly. <i>Every single vote was <b>accurately</b> counted.</i>
<b>apparent</b>	Clearly visible or understood; obvious. <i>It became <b>apparent</b> that he was talented.</i>
<b>assured</b>	Protected against discontinuance or change. <i>An extremely <b>assured</b> performance.</i>
<b>assuredly</b>	Used to express the speaker's certainty that something is true. <i>Potted roses will most <b>assuredly</b> not survive winter without protection.</i>

<b>convinced</b>	Persuaded of; very sure. <i>I am <b>convinced</b> the war will be over in a matter of months.</i>
<b>decidedly</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>No Donna said <b>decidedly</b>.</i>
<b>definite</b>	Having exact and discernible physical limits or form. <i>We had no <b>definite</b> plans.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>I shall <b>definitely</b> be at the airport to meet you.</i>

<b>determinate</b>	(of a flowering shoot) having the main axis ending in a flower bud and therefore no longer extending in length, as in a cyme. <i>The longest <b>determinate</b> prison sentence ever upheld by English courts.</i>
<b>doubtless</b>	Presumably or very probably. <i>The company would <b>doubtless</b> find the reduced competition to their liking.</i>
<b>evidently</b>	In a way that is clearly seen or understood; obviously. <i>She was in bed and <b>evidently</b> in great pain.</i>
<b>expressly</b>	With specific intentions; for the express purpose. <i>The house was <b>expressly</b> built for entertaining.</i>
<b>indeed</b>	Expressing interest of an ironic kind with repetition of a question just asked. <i>She should have no trouble hearing him No <b>indeed</b>.</i>
<b>indubitable</b>	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. <i>An <b>indubitable</b> truth.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>It was immediately and <b>indubitably</b> apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>
<b>justified</b>	Having words so spaced that lines have straight even margins. <i>The doctors were <b>justified</b> in treating her.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>Unemployment has been the most <b>obvious</b> cost of the recession.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i><b>Obviously</b> everyone has to do what they think is right.</i>
<b>outweigh</b>	Be heavier, greater, or more significant than. <i>These considerations <b>outweigh</b> our wishes.</i>
<b>sure</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>A <b>sure</b> footing.</i>
<b>surely</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>The results are <b>surely</b> encouraging.</i>
<b>truly</b>	With sincerity; without pretense. <i>It is <b>truly</b> a privilege to be here.</i>
<b>undoubtedly</b>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>It is <b>undoubtedly</b> very beautiful.</i>
<b>unequivocal</b>	Clearly defined or formulated- R.B.Taney. <i><b>Unequivocal</b> evidence.</i>
