- *The person in charge of a meeting or of an organization (used as a neutral alternative to chairman or chairwoman).*
- *The officer who presides at the meetings of an organization.*
- *The post of a chairperson.*
- *The position of professor.*
- *A seat for one person, with a support for the back.*
- *A particular seat in an orchestra.*
- *A separate seat for one person, typically with a back and four legs.*
- *A professorship.*
- *A metal socket holding a rail in place on a railway sleeper.*

- *An instrument of execution by electrocution; resembles an ordinary seat for one person.*

seat	A sitting place for a passenger in a vehicle or for a member of an audience. <i>He dusted off the seat before sitting down.</i>
spokesman	A person who makes statements on behalf of a group or individual. <i>A spokesman for Greenpeace.</i>
spokesperson	A spokesman or spokeswoman (used as a neutral alternative). <i>A spokesperson for the Scottish Office.</i>
spokeswoman	A woman who makes statements on behalf of a group or individual. <i>A spokeswoman for the agency said it would not be investigating the case.</i>

- *Act as chairperson of or preside over (an organization, meeting, or public event.*
- *Carry (someone) aloft in a chair or in a sitting position to celebrate a victory.*

officiate at Perform duties attached to a particular office or place or function.

preside over Act as president.

take the chair of Require (time or space).

- bedspread** Decorative cover for a bed.

bench	Exhibit on a bench. <i>His appointment to the civil bench.</i>
bookcase	An open cabinet containing shelves on which to keep books.
cafeteria	A restaurant in which customers serve themselves from a counter and pay before eating. <i>Employers who offer cafeteria plans and other flexible programs.</i>
couch	A flat coat of paint or varnish used by artists as a primer. <i>Gold and silver threads couched by hand.</i>
creak	Make a high-pitched, screeching noise. <i>The garden gate creaked open.</i>
cupboard	A small room (or recess) or cabinet used for storage space. <i>A broom cupboard.</i>
curtain	Conceal or screen with a curtain. <i>A curtain of trees.</i>
cushion	A bag of cloth stuffed with a mass of soft material, used as a comfortable support for sitting or leaning on. <i>Underlay forms a cushion between carpet and floor.</i>
desk	A specified section of a newspaper or broadcasting organization. <i>He landed a job on the sports desk.</i>
desktop	The working area of a computer screen regarded as a representation of a notional desktop and containing icons representing items such as files. <i>You can now have multiple overlapping windows on the desktop.</i>
dining	The act of eating dinner. <i>The city has become a capital of fine dining.</i>
fridge	A refrigerator in which the coolant is pumped around by an electric motor. <i>She put the carton of milk back in the fridge.</i>
furnishing	Furniture, fittings, and other decorative accessories such as curtains and carpets, for a house or room. <i>The furnishing comprised three easy chairs and one oval table.</i>
furniture	Pieces of wood or metal placed round or between metal type to make blank spaces and fasten the type in the chase. <i>They had too much furniture for the small apartment.</i>
lounge	An upholstered seat for more than one person. <i>A TV lounge.</i>
pillow	Rest on or as if on a pillow. <i>His head was pillowed on his arm.</i>
proscenium	The stage of an ancient theatre.

recline	Cause to recline. <i>He tried to recline his seat.</i>
recliner	An armchair whose back can be lowered and foot can be raised to allow the sitter to recline in it.
screech	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>The van screeched round a bend at speed.</i>
seat	Of a vehicle or building have seats for a specified number of people. <i>Owen seated his guests in the draughty baronial hall.</i>
sit	Sit and travel on the back of animal usually while controlling its motions. <i>You can sit wherever you like.</i>
sofa	An upholstered seat for more than one person. <i>Sofa cushions.</i>
squeak	Something achieved (or escaped) by a narrow margin. <i>The bill squeaked through with just six votes to spare.</i>
stool	Lure with a stool as of wild fowl. <i>Fibre in the child s diet will soften the stools.</i>
table	A piece of furniture with tableware for a meal laid out on it. <i>I d like the issue to be tabled for the next few months.</i>
terrace	Make into terraces as for cultivation. <i>The Incas terraced their mountainous land.</i>
