- chairperson** A chairman or chairwoman (used as a neutral alternative).

- convener** A senior trade union official at a workplace.  
*A local Transport Union **convener**.*
- president** The office of the United States head of state.  
*The **president** of the European Union.*

## Synonyms of "Chairman" as a verb (1 Word)

**chair** Act or preside as chair as of an academic department in a university.  
*She **chaired** the department for many years.*



## Associations of "Chairman" (30 Words)

**administration** The act of administering medication.  
*Things were quiet during the Eisenhower **administration**.*

**board** A flat portable surface usually rectangular designed for board games.  
***Board** and lodging.*

**caucus** Of a voter attend an electoral caucus especially on behalf of a particular candidate.  
*Up to fifty **caucuses** met daily on conference grounds to discuss lobbying strategies.*

<b>chairperson</b>	A chairman or chairwoman (used as a neutral alternative). <i>Address your remarks to the <b>chairperson</b>.</i>
<b><u>commanding</u></b>	Used of a height or viewpoint. <i>A <b>commanding</b> officer.</i>
<b>consular</b>	Relating to the ancient Roman consuls, two annually elected chief magistrates who jointly ruled the republic. <i>Rome once again held <b>consular</b> elections.</i>
<b>corruption</b>	The action or effect of making someone or something morally depraved. <i>The luxury and <b>corruption</b> among the upper classes.</i>
<b>democratic</b>	(in the US) relating to the Democratic Party. <i>A <b>democratic</b> or popular movement.</i>
<b><u>elect</u></b>	Select by a vote for an office or membership. <i>Success was a sign that they were one of the <b>elect</b>.</i>
<b>elected</b>	Subject to popular election.
<b>election</b>	The predestination of some individuals as objects of divine mercy (especially as conceived by Calvinists). <i>They celebrated his <b>election</b>.</i>
<b><u>elective</u></b>	An optional course of study. <i>The National Assembly with 125 <b>elective</b> members.</i>
<b>electorate</b>	The body of enfranchised citizens; those qualified to vote. <i>75 per cent of the <b>electorate</b> voted for a Scottish parliament in some form.</i>
<b><u>executive</u></b>	Suitable for a senior business executive. <i>The <b>executive</b> branch of government.</i>
<b>fed</b>	Any federal law enforcement officer.
<b>govern</b>	Conduct oneself, especially with regard to controlling one's emotions. <i>His belief in God <b>governs</b> his conduct.</i>
<b><u>governing</u></b>	The act of governing exercising authority. <i>Regulations for the <b>governing</b> of state prisons.</i>
<b><u>government</u></b>	Government the system or form by which a community or other political unit is governed. <i>He had considerable experience of <b>government</b>.</i>
<b>governor</b>	The elected executive head of a state of the US. <i>The <b>governor</b> of the Bank of England.</i>
<b>mayor</b>	(in the US, Canada, and certain other countries) the head of a municipal corporation, elected by the public.

<b>minister</b>	Administer a sacrament. <i>The Angels are <b>ministers</b> of the Divine Will.</i>
<b>misrule</b>	Government that is inefficient or dishonest. <i>He <b>misruled</b> his country for fourteen years.</i>
<b>political</b>	Interested in or active in politics. <i>A <b>political</b> machine.</i>
<b><u>president</u></b>	The office of the United States head of state. <i>The <b>president</b> of the European Union.</i>
<b>privatization</b>	The transfer of a business, industry, or service from public to private ownership and control. <i>The government launched a new round of <b>privatizations</b>.</i>
<b>rector</b>	(in other Anglican Churches) a member of the clergy who has charge of a parish.
<b><u>regime</u></b>	A coordinated programme for the promotion or restoration of health a regimen. <i>Ideological opponents of the <b>regime</b>.</i>
<b>tenure</b>	Guaranteed permanent employment especially as a teacher or lecturer after a probationary period security of tenure. <i><b>Tenure</b> for university staff has been abolished.</i>
<b><u>tyrannical</u></b>	Characteristic of tyranny; oppressive and controlling. <i>A <b>tyrannical</b> parent.</i>
<b>voting</b>	A choice that is made by counting the number of people in favor of each alternative.
