bedchamber	A bedroom.
<u>bedroom</u>	A room used primarily for sleeping. <i>A two bedroom flat.</i>
boudoir	A woman's bedroom or small private room.
cavity	Space that is surrounded by something. <i>The abdominal cavity.</i>
<u>cell</u>	The local area covered by one of the short range transmitters in a cellular telephone system. <i>The cells of a honeycomb.</i>
chamber of deputies	A room where a judge transacts business.
chambers	An enclosed volume in the body.
<u>compartment</u>	A space into which an area is subdivided. <i>A first class compartment.</i>
congress	The legislature of the United States government. <i>Sexual congress.</i>
convocation	(in the Church of England) a representative assembly of clergy of the province of Canterbury or York. <i>The arguments delayed the convocation of the first congress planned for February 1992.</i>
<u>council</u>	Denoting housing provided by a local council at a subsidized rent. <i>Student council.</i>
<u>diet</u>	A legislative assembly in certain countries (e.g., Japan). <i>Screen violence is becoming the staple diet of the video generation.</i>
<u>hall</u>	A university building containing rooms for students to live in. <i>Lecture hall.</i>
hollow	A depression hollowed out of solid matter. <i>He held them in the hollow of his hand.</i>
house	The management of a gambling house or casino. <i>They had a large carriage house.</i>

legislature	The legislative body of a country or state. <i>The Nevada state legislature passed a law to prohibit dumping of nuclear waste.</i>
living quarters	The experience of being alive; the course of human events and activities.
lower chamber	The lower of two berths.
lower house	The lower of two berths.
pocket	A small bag sewn into or on clothing so as to form part of it, used for carrying small articles. <i>The pack has two main compartments and four pockets.</i>
quarters	A fourth part of a year; three months. <i>I visited his bachelor quarters.</i>
<u>room</u>	The people who are present in a room. <i>The rooms were very small but they had a nice view.</i>
rooms	Apartment consisting of a series of connected rooms used as a living unit as in a hotel.
second chamber	Merchandise that has imperfections; usually sold at a reduced price without the brand name.
senate	Assembly possessing high legislative powers. <i>The senate must ratify any treaty with a two thirds majority.</i>
sleeping accommodation	Quiet and inactive restfulness.
sleeping room	The state of being asleep.
upper chamber	A central nervous system stimulant that increases energy and decreases appetite; used to treat narcolepsy and some forms of depression.
upper house	Piece of leather or synthetic material that forms the part of a shoe or boot above the sole that encases the foot.

- apartment** A suite of rooms usually on one floor of an apartment house.
*The family lived in a rented **apartment**.*
- assembly** The action of fitting together the component parts of a machine or other object.
*They demanded the right of **assembly**.*
- associational** Of or relating to associations or associationism.
- bedroom** Relating to sexual relations.
*A two **bedroom** flat.*
- bedside** Space by the side of a bed (especially the bed of a sick or dying person).
*The doctor stood at her **bedside**.*
- bicameral** Composed of two legislative bodies.
*A **bicameral** Parliament consisting of an appointed Senate and a popularly elected House of Assembly.*

bunk	Sleep in a bunk or improvised bed typically in shared quarters. <i>We bunked the children upstairs.</i>
cabin	Confine to a small space such as a cabin. <i>Animals are not allowed in the cabin of the aircraft.</i>
caravan	Travel in a caravan. <i>We were part of a caravan of almost a thousand camels.</i>
conference	Take part in a conference or conference call. <i>An international conference on the environment.</i>
congress	A national legislative body, especially that of the US. The US Congress, which meets at the Capitol in Washington DC, was established by the Constitution of 1787 and is composed of the Senate and the House of Representatives. <i>The lovers met discreetly for the purposes of sexual congress.</i>
convocation	A group gathered in response to a summons. <i>The arguments delayed the convocation of the first congress planned for February 1992.</i>
cottage	A small house, typically one in the country. <i>Farm cottages.</i>
doorstep	A step leading up to the outer door of a house. <i>Doorstep sandwiches.</i>
flophouse	A cheap lodging house. <i>They are living in a flophouse and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
fraternity	A group of people sharing a common profession or interests. <i>Members of the hunting fraternity.</i>
furnished	Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority). <i>A completely furnished toolbox.</i>
gathering	The act of gathering something. <i>A family gathering.</i>
habitable	Suitable or good enough to live in. <i>The habitable world.</i>
hostel	A hotel providing overnight lodging for travelers.
judiciary	The judicial authorities of a country; judges collectively. <i>The independence of the judiciary.</i>
kitchen	A set of fittings and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen. <i>The dried shrimp pastes of the Thai kitchen.</i>

legislature	The legislative body of a country or state. <i>The Nevada state legislature passed a law to prohibit dumping of nuclear waste.</i>
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The money is lodged in a bank.</i>
meeting	An organized event at which a number of races or other sporting contests are held. <i>He intrigued her on their first meeting.</i>
mews	A group of stables, typically with rooms above, built round a yard or along an alley. <i>A mews house.</i>
parliament	A legislature similar to the UK Parliament in other nations and states. <i>It is uncommon to see a parliament of owls in the wild.</i>
<u>room</u>	A set of rooms typically rented in which a person couple or family live. <i>The whole room was cheering.</i>
<u>suite</u>	A set of rooms designated for one person's or family's use or for a particular purpose. <i>The Royal Saloon was built for the use of the Queen and her suite.</i>
