enactment	The controlled expression and acceptance of repressed emotions or impulses in behaviour during therapy. The <b>enactment</b> of equal pay legislation.
personation	Imitating the mannerisms of another person.
picture	A person or thing resembling another closely. They showed us the <b>picture</b> s of their wedding.
portrayal	A word picture of a person's appearance and character. <i>His <b>portrayal</b> of the title character.</i>
word picture	The divine word of God; the second person in the Trinity (incarnate in Jesus.
word-painting	A graphic or vivid verbal description.

delineation	Representation by drawing or painting etc. <i>The artist s exquisite</i> <b>delineation</b> of costume and jewellery.

draw	The act of drawing or hauling something. Before establishing his diamonds declarer must <b>draw</b> trumps.
explain	Minimize the significance of an embarrassing fact or action by giving an excuse or justification. It s a device of great age the professor <b>explain</b> ed.
explanatory	Serving or intended to explain or make clear. An <b>explanatory</b> paragraph.
expound	State. The abbess <b>expound</b> ed the scriptures to her nuns.
express	Serve as a means for expressing something. He <b>express</b> ed complete satisfaction.
fresco	The method of painting frescoes used in Roman times and by the great masters of the Italian Renaissance including Giotto Raphael and Michelangelo. <i>Four scenes had been frescoed on the wall.</i>
<u>gallery</u>	A covered corridor (especially one extending along the wall of a building and supported with arches or columns. An art <b>gallery</b> .
<u>illustrate</u>	Serve as an example of. The World Cup <b>illustrate</b> d what high standards our players must achieve.
illustration	A visual representation (a picture or diagram) that is used make some subject more pleasing or easier to understand. An <b>illustration</b> of a yacht.
<u>interpret</u>	Give an interpretation or explanation to. <i>He would no longer <b>interpret</b> her silence as indifference.</i>
personality	The quality or fact of being a person as distinct from a thing or animal. <i>She is a Hollywood <b>personality</b>.</i>
photography	The process of producing images of objects on photosensitive surfaces.
picture	Represent in a photograph or picture. <i>Too often the narrative was interrupted by long word <b>picture</b>s.</i>
pixel	(computer science) the smallest discrete component of an image or picture on a CRT screen (usually a colored dot. <i>The camera scans photographs and encodes the image into <b>pixel</b>s.</i>



portraiture	A word picture of a person's appearance and character. His strength as a novelist lay in his <b>portraiture</b> of upper class families.
portray	Portray in words. The actor <b>portray</b> s an elderly lonely man.
portrayal	Acting the part of a character on stage; dramatically representing the character by speech and action and gesture. The media <b>portrayal</b> of immigration.
presentment	An accusation of crime made by a grand jury on its own initiative.
report	Cover an event or subject as a journalist or a reporter. <i>His father signed his <b>report</b> card</i> .
representation	The act of representing; standing in for someone or some group and speaking with authority in their behalf. The <b>representation</b> of women in newspapers.
woodcut	The technique of making woodcuts.
