- *A map designed to assist navigation by air or sea.*
- *A weekly listing of the current bestselling pop records.*

artist's impression The act of pressing one thing on or into the surface of another.

blueprint Something intended as a guide for making something else.
A **blueprint** for a house.

diagram A drawing intended to explain how something works; a drawing showing the relation between the parts.
A **diagram** of the living room.

drawing The act of moving a load by drawing or pulling.
It is shown by the **drawing** in Fig 7.

figure One of the elements that collectively form a system of numeration.
By 1998 this **figure** had risen to 14 million.

graph A diagram showing the relation between variable quantities, typically of two variables, each measured along one of a pair of axes at right angles.

grid	A field for American football a gridiron. <i>The reactor was connected to the grid in 1985.</i>
guide	A member of the Guide Association. <i>A comprehensive guide to British hotels and restaurants.</i>
histogram	A bar chart representing a frequency distribution; heights of the bars represent observed frequencies.

illustration	Artwork that helps make something clear or attractive. <i>An illustration of a yacht.</i>
<u>layout</u>	The way in which text or pictures are set out on a page. <i>Doing layout for newspapers and magazines.</i>
map	A diagram or collection of data showing the spatial arrangement or distribution of something over an area. <i>You ought to know my map by now.</i>
scale drawing	A flattened rigid plate forming part of the body covering of many animals.
scheme	An elaborate and systematic plan of action. <i>The whole scheme is plunged into darkness bar the light in Victor s house.</i>
<u>sketch</u>	A rough or unfinished version of any creative work. <i>A hilarious sketch for their latest BBC series.</i>
table	Multiplication tables. <i>I reserved a table at my favorite restaurant.</i>
tabulation	Information set out in tabular form. <i>The tabulation of the results.</i>
top twenty	The greatest possible intensity.

outline	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. <i>She outlined the case briefly.</i>
plot	Make (a curve) by marking out a number of points on a graph. <i>A cooling curve is plotted and the freezing point determined.</i>
portray	Portray in words. <i>He chose Trevor Howard to portray Captain Bligh.</i>
record	Make a record of set down in permanent form. <i>They recorded her singing.</i>
register	Manipulate the registers of an organ. <i>Nothing registered on their faces.</i>
report	Be responsible for reporting the details of as in journalism. <i>The cub reporter covered New York City.</i>
survey	Make a survey of for statistical purposes. <i>95 per cent of patients surveyed were satisfied with the health service.</i>
trace	Discover traces of. <i>The hunters traced the deer into the woods.</i>

machination	A crafty and involved plot to achieve your (usually sinister) ends.

- representation** In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit.
*This concept is shown in **schematic** form in Figure 1.*
- schematic** In a way that relates to the gaining of a military advantage.

- strategically** (of a conviction) made by a judge or magistrate without a jury.
