<b>histogram</b>	A bar chart representing a frequency distribution; heights of the bars represent observed frequencies.
<b>hit parade</b>	A brief event in which two or more bodies come together.
<b>illustration</b>	Artwork that helps make something clear or attractive. <i>An <b>illustration</b> of a yacht.</i>
<a href="#"><u>layout</u></a>	The way in which text or pictures are set out on a page. <i>Doing <b>layout</b> for newspapers and magazines.</i>
<b>map</b>	A diagram or collection of data showing the spatial arrangement or distribution of something over an area. <i>You ought to know my <b>map</b> by now.</i>
<b>scale drawing</b>	A flattened rigid plate forming part of the body covering of many animals.
<b>scheme</b>	An elaborate and systematic plan of action. <i>The whole <b>scheme</b> is plunged into darkness bar the light in Victor s house.</i>
<a href="#"><u>sketch</u></a>	A rough or unfinished version of any creative work. <i>A hilarious <b>sketch</b> for their latest BBC series.</i>
<b>table</b>	Multiplication tables. <i>I reserved a <b>table</b> at my favorite restaurant.</i>
<b>tabulation</b>	Information set out in tabular form. <i>The <b>tabulation</b> of the results.</i>
<b>top twenty</b>	The greatest possible intensity.

<b>log</b>	Enter into a log as on ships and planes. <i>The incident has to be <b>logged</b>.</i>
<b>note</b>	Make a written note of. <i>Take <b>note</b> of this chemical reaction.</i>
<b>outline</b>	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. <i>She <b>outlined</b> the case briefly.</i>
<b>plot</b>	Make (a curve) by marking out a number of points on a graph. <i>A cooling curve is <b>plotted</b> and the freezing point determined.</i>
<b>portray</b>	Portray in words. <i>He chose Trevor Howard to <b>portray</b> Captain Bligh.</i>
<b>record</b>	Make a record of set down in permanent form. <i>They <b>recorded</b> her singing.</i>
<b>register</b>	Manipulate the registers of an organ. <i>Nothing <b>registered</b> on their faces.</i>
<b>report</b>	Be responsible for reporting the details of as in journalism. <i>The cub <b>reporter</b> covered New York City.</i>
<b>survey</b>	Make a survey of for statistical purposes. <i>95 per cent of patients <b>surveyed</b> were satisfied with the health service.</i>

<b>flowchart</b>	A diagram of the sequence of operations in a computer program or an accounting system.
<b>formulaic</b>	Constituting or containing a set form of words. <i><b>Formulaic</b> disposable pop.</i>
<b>graph</b>	Plot or trace on a graph.
<b>graphic</b>	Of or relating to the graphic arts British Book News. <i>A <b>graphic</b> presentation of the data.</i>

- representation** In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit.

- schematic** In a way that relates to the gaining of a military advantage.  
*We have to think **strategically** about how best to utilize our facilities.*
