## Synonyms of "Chasm" as a noun (14 Words)

<b><u>abyss</u></b>	A deep or seemingly bottomless chasm. <i>A rope led down into the dark <b>abyss</b>.</i>
<b>breach</b>	A failure to perform some promised act or obligation. <i>A <b>breach</b> in the mountain wall.</i>
<b><u>canyon</u></b>	A ravine formed by a river in an area with little rainfall. <i>The Grand <b>Canyon</b>.</i>
<b>cleft</b>	A split or indentation in something (as the palate or chin.
<b>couloir</b>	A steep, narrow gully on a mountainside.
<b>crevasse</b>	A deep fissure.
<b><u>defile</u></b>	A narrow pass (especially one between mountains.
<b>gorge</b>	The contents of the stomach.
<b>gulf</b>	A deep wide chasm. <i>He felt a <b>gulf</b> between himself and his former friends.</i>
<b>gully</b>	A fielder at gully. <i>He was caught in the <b>gully</b> by Jones.</i>
<b>pass</b>	Any authorization to pass or go somewhere. <i>He had a <b>pass</b> for three days.</i>
<b>ravine</b>	A deep, narrow gorge with steep sides.
<b>rent</b>	The act of rending or ripping or splitting something. <i>The rise in council house <b>rents</b>.</i>
<b><u>rift</u></b>	A major fault separating blocks of the earth s surface a rift valley. <i>The sun shone through a <b>rift</b> in the clouds.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Chasm" as a noun

- *A chasm a mile long.*
- *The chasm between rich and poor.*
- *He was engulfed in a chasm of despair.*



## Associations of "Chasm" (30 Words)

<b>arroyo</b>	A stream or brook.
<b>beck</b>	A beckoning gesture.
<b>canyon</b>	A deep gorge, typically one with a river flowing through it, as found in North America. <i>The Grand <b>Canyon</b>.</i>
<b>cascade</b>	Rush down in big quantities like a cascade. <i>A <b>cascade</b> of anti war literature.</i>
<b>cliff</b>	A steep high face of rock. <i>A coast path along the top of rugged <b>cliffs</b>.</i>
<b>deep</b>	Far down or in deeply. <i>A <b>deep</b> trance.</i>
<b>defile</b>	A narrow pass (especially one between mountains). <i>He took her behind the building and <b>defiled</b> her.</i>
<b>disgorge</b>	Cause or allow (a solid substance) to flow or run out or over. <i>The combine <b>disgorged</b> a steady stream of grain.</i>
<b>foothill</b>	A relatively low hill on the lower slope of a mountain. <i>The camp lies in the <b>foothills</b> of the Andes.</i>
<b>glen</b>	A narrow valley, especially in Scotland or Ireland.
<b>glut</b>	Supply or fill to excess. <i>There is a <b>glut</b> of cars on the market.</i>
<b>gorge</b>	The contents of the stomach. <i>They <b>gorged</b> themselves on Cornish cream teas.</i>
<b>height</b>	The vertical dimension of extension; distance from the base of something to the top. <i>Her <b>height</b> marked her out from other women.</i>
<b>incised</b>	Cut or impressed into a surface. <i>An <b>incised</b> design.</i>
<b>ledge</b>	A window ledge. <i>He heaved himself up over a <b>ledge</b>.</i>
<b>marsh</b>	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Thousands of acres of <b>marshland</b>.</i>
<b>overeat</b>	Overeat or eat immodestly make a pig of oneself. <i>If your friends <b>overeate</b> you re more likely to <b>overeate</b> too.</i>

<b><u>precipice</u></b>	A very steep cliff. <i>We swerved toward the edge of the <b>precipice</b>.</i>
<b>ranch</b>	Use land as a ranch. <i>Her husband is <b>ranching</b> in Arizona.</i>
<b>ravine</b>	A deep, narrow gorge with steep sides.
<b><u>rift</u></b>	A major fault separating blocks of the earth's surface a rift valley. <i>The Indian landmass <b>rifted</b> from Madagascar about 90 million years ago.</i>
<b><u>river</u></b>	A large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea a lake or another river. <i>The <b>river</b> was navigable for 50 miles.</i>
<b><u>steep</u></b>	A steep place as on a hill. <i>Note the <b>steep</b> incline.</i>
<b><u>stream</u></b>	Something that resembles a flowing stream in moving continuously. <i>The raft floated down<b>stream</b> on the current.</i>
<b>tigris</b>	An Asian river; a tributary of the Euphrates River.
<b><u>trickle</u></b>	Cause (a liquid) to flow in a small stream. <i>Philip <b>trickled</b> a line of sauce on his fish fingers.</i>
<b><u>vale</u></b>	A valley (used in place names or as a poetic term). <i>The <b>Vale</b> of Glamorgan.</i>
<b><u>valley</u></b>	A long depression in the surface of the land that usually contains a river. <i>The <b>valley</b> floor.</i>
<b><u>waterfall</u></b>	A cascade of water falling from a height, formed when a river or stream flows over a precipice or steep incline. <i>Each phase of a <b>waterfall</b> project must be complete prior to moving to the next phase.</i>
