- *Morally pure (especially not having experienced sexual intercourse).*
- *Not having any sexual nature or intention.*
- *Without unnecessary ornamentation; simple or restrained.*
- *Abstaining from extramarital, or from all, sexual intercourse.*
- *Abstaining from unlawful sexual intercourse.*

ascetic	Pertaining to or characteristic of an ascetic or the practice of rigorous self discipline. <i>An ascetic life of prayer fasting and manual labour.</i>
austere	(of living conditions or a way of life) having no comforts or luxuries. <i>Conditions in the prison could hardly be more austere.</i>
bare	Just barely adequate or within a lower limit. <i>A bare livelihood.</i>
friendly	Easy to understand or use. <i>Friendly rivalry between the two schools.</i>
functional	Relating to the way in which something works or operates. <i>Using functional notation we can write where L is the transactions demand for money.</i>
innocent	Free from evil or guilt. <i>An innocent bystander.</i>
intact	Not damaged or impaired in any way; complete. <i>She was intact virginal.</i>
maiden	(of a female animal) not having mated. <i>The top priced maiden heifer.</i>
maidenly	Relating to or appropriate to a maiden; demure. <i>A maidenly blush.</i>
monastic	Resembling or suggestive of monks or their way of life, especially in being austere, solitary, or celibate. <i>A monastic order.</i>
plain	Free from any effort to soften to disguise. <i>Plain water.</i>
platonic	Of or relating to or characteristic of Plato or his philosophy. <i>Platonic love.</i>
restrained	Marked by avoidance of extravagance or extremes. <i>Restrained in his response.</i>
simple	Apart from anything else; without additions or modifications. <i>The simple truth.</i>
spartan	Of or relating to or characteristic of Sparta or its people. <i>A spartan existence.</i>
unadorned	Not adorned; plain. <i>The unadorned truth.</i>

unaffected	Undergoing no change when acted upon. <i>Entirely unaffected by each other s writings.</i>
uncluttered	Not having or impeded by too many objects, details, or elements. <i>An uncluttered room.</i>
undecorated	Not decorated with something to increase its beauty or distinction. <i>The walls were completely undecorated.</i>
unembellished	Not embellished or decorated. <i>The unembellished truth.</i>
unfussy	Not fussy. <i>A simple unfussy design.</i>
unmarried	Not married or related to the unmarried state. <i>Unmarried life.</i>
unornamented	Lacking embellishment or ornamentation. <i>An unornamented two storey building.</i>
unpretentious	Not ostentatious. <i>Her quiet unpretentious demeanor.</i>
virginal	Being, relating to, or appropriate for a virgin. <i>Nor is there anything more virginal than the shimmer of young foliage.</i>

ethic	Relating to moral principles or the branch of knowledge dealing with these. <i>The puritan ethic was being replaced by the hedonist ethic.</i>
ethical	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>Switching to more ethical products.</i>
ethics	Motivation based on ideas of right and wrong. <i>Many scientists question the ethics of cruel experiments.</i>
exemplar	A person or thing serving as a typical example or appropriate model. <i>The place is an exemplar of multicultural Britain.</i>
flawless	Without any imperfections or defects; perfect. <i>Her smooth flawless skin.</i>
immaculate	Uniformly coloured without spots or other marks. <i>In her immaculate white uniform.</i>
impeccable	Not capable of sin. <i>Speaks impeccable French.</i>
infallible	Incapable of failure or error. <i>For an encyclical to be infallible the Pope must speak ex cathedra.</i>
innocent	Completely wanting or lacking. <i>A man innocent of war s cruelties.</i>
justification	The act of defending or explaining or making excuses for by reasoning- H.J.Muller. <i>There is no justification for an increase in charges.</i>
justness	The quality of being just or fair. <i>It was performed with justness and beauty.</i>
moral	A lesson that can be derived from a story or experience. <i>Moral philosophers.</i>
perfection	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>His pursuit of golfing perfection.</i>
pure	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>Pure primary colors.</i>
puritan	Someone who adheres to strict religious principles; someone opposed to sensual pleasures. <i>My mother was a puritan about sex.</i>
qualm	A momentary faint or sick feeling. <i>Military regimes generally have no qualms about controlling the press.</i>
rectitude	Morally correct behaviour or thinking; righteousness. <i>Mattie is a model of rectitude.</i>

<u>righteous</u>	Very good; excellent. <i>Feelings of righteous indignation about pay and conditions.</i>
scruple	Raise scruples. <i>Without scruple politicians use fear as a persuasion weapon.</i>
sinless	Free from sin. <i>The sinless life of Christ.</i>
turpitude	Depraved or wicked behaviour or character. <i>Acts of moral turpitude.</i>
uprightness	The condition or quality of being honourable or honest; rectitude. <i>Steadying himself he slowly managed to achieve a state of relative uprightness.</i>
virtue	A quality considered morally good or desirable in a person. <i>There s no virtue in suffering in silence.</i>
<u>virtuous</u>	Morally excellent. <i>She considered herself very virtuous because she neither drank nor smoked.</i>
