According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “checklist” as a noun can have the following definitions:

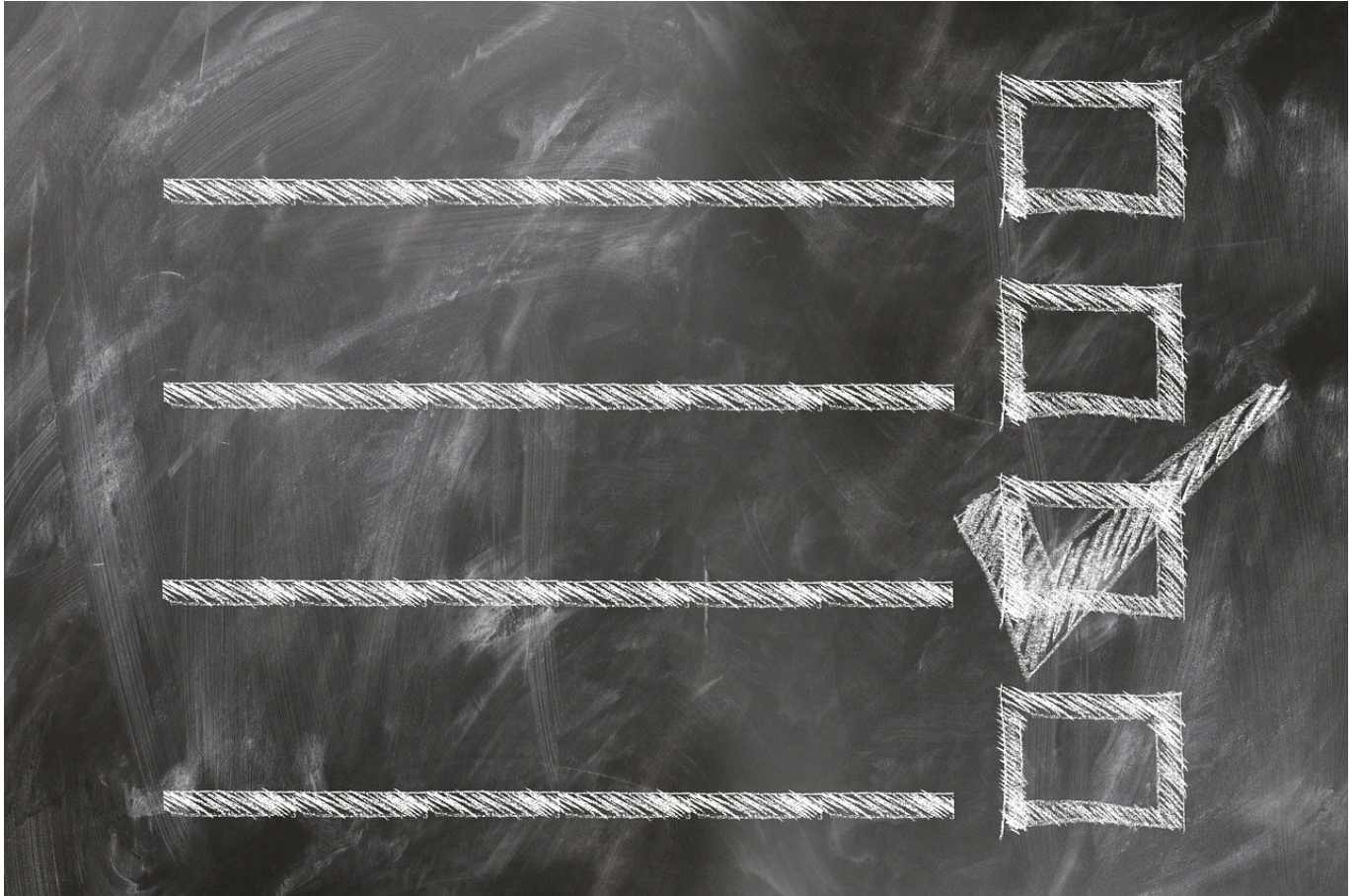
- *A list of items (names or tasks etc.) to be checked or consulted.*
- *A list of items required, things to be done, or points to be considered, used as a reminder.*



Synonyms of "Checklist" as a noun (16 Words)

- catalogue** A complete list of items, typically one in alphabetical or other systematic order.
*His life was a **catalogue** of dismal failures.*
- directory** A listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk).
- docket** A voucher entitling the holder to receive or obtain delivery of goods ordered.
*One new case on the **docket** from Florida.*
- enumeration** The act of counting; reciting numbers in ascending order.
*It is not necessary to give an exhaustive **enumeration** of the circumstances.*
- file** A steel hand tool with small sharp teeth on some or all of its surfaces; used for smoothing wood or metal.
*You can save the **file** to your hard disk.*

<u>index</u>	An alphabetical listing of names and topics along with page numbers where they are discussed. <i>The oral hygiene index was calculated as the sum of the debris and calculus indices.</i>
inventory	The value of a firm's current assets including raw materials and work in progress and finished goods. <i>They carried a vast inventory of hardware.</i>
listicle	A piece of writing or other content presented wholly or partly in the form of a list. <i>A recent BuzzFeed listicle called 21 Pictures That Will Restore Your Faith in Humanity has attracted more than 13 million views.</i>
listing	The drawing up of a list.
record	Anything such as a document or a phonograph record or a photograph providing permanent evidence of or information about past events. <i>I'm listening to records in my room.</i>
<u>register</u>	A cashbox with an adding machine to register transactions used in shops to add up the bill. <i>I had signed the register with my new name.</i>
roll	A gymnastic exercise in which a person tucks their head down and rolls their body in a forward or backwards circle on the floor. <i>A roll of mints.</i>
table	A list of rivals or competitors showing their positions relative to one another a league table. <i>The negotiating table.</i>
tabulation	The act of putting into tabular form. <i>The tabulation of the results.</i>
<u>tally</u>	An account kept by means of a tally. <i>The key is so cut as to form a tally with the interior machinery.</i>
<u>ticket</u>	(in information technology) a request logged on a work tracking system detailing an issue that needs to be addressed or task that must be performed. <i>Companies that appeared to have a one way ticket to profitability.</i>

<u>benchmark</u>	Give particular results during a benchmark test. <i>The device should benchmark at between 100 and 150 MHz.</i>
<u>book</u>	A bookmaker's record of bets accepted and money paid out. <i>A pattern book.</i>
booklet	A small book usually having a paper cover.
brochure	A small book or magazine containing pictures and information about a product or service. <i>A holiday brochure.</i>
catalog	Make a catalogue compile a catalogue. <i>He found it in the Sears catalog.</i>

confirm	Administer the religious rite of confirmation to. <i>If these fears are confirmed the outlook for the economy will be dire.</i>
correct	Correct in opinion or judgment. <i>The correct version.</i>
<u>data</u>	A collection of facts from which conclusions may be drawn. <i>Statistical data.</i>
encyclopedia	A book or set of books giving information on many subjects or on many aspects of one subject and typically arranged alphabetically.
<u>file</u>	File a formal charge against. <i>File for divorce.</i>
folder	A folding cover or holder, typically made of stiff paper or card, for storing loose papers.
handbook	A book giving information such as facts on a particular subject or instructions for operating a machine. <i>The handbook says an alkaline battery should be good for around 2000 hours of continuous performance.</i>
handout	A quantity of financial or other material aid given to a person or organization. <i>Dependence on central government handouts.</i>
<u>index</u>	List in an index. <i>Clear cross references supplemented by a thorough index.</i>
inventory	A quantity of merchandise or goods held in stock. <i>They held an inventory every month.</i>
leaflet	Distribute leaflets to people or an area. <i>Tourists visiting the area are being leafleted.</i>
list	Be on a list of products at a specified price. <i>Consult the list of drugs on page 326.</i>
page	The material written or printed on a page. <i>He was turning the pages of his Sunday newspaper.</i>
pamphlet	Distribute pamphlets to. <i>A handful of heritage minded citizens who pamphleted their neighbours.</i>
pamphleteer	Write and issue political or controversial pamphlets. <i>The right to pamphleteer and post bills anonymously is as important today as it was three centuries ago.</i>

paper	Apply wallpaper to a wall or room. <i>Murdoch owns many newspapers.</i>
poster	Put up posters in an area. <i>A poster advertised the coming attractions.</i>
<u>questionnaire</u>	A form containing a set of questions; submitted to people to gain statistical information.
<u>roster</u>	Place on or assign according to a duty roster. <i>The locomotive is rostered for service on Sunday.</i>
specifier	Someone who draws up specifications giving details (as for obtaining a patent).
stationery	Paper cut to an appropriate size for writing letters; usually with matching envelopes. <i>A range of stationery.</i>
<u>tab</u>	Identify as being of a specified type or suitable for a specified position. <i>He was tabbed by the President as the next Republican National Committee chairman.</i>
tilt	Charge with a tilt. <i>Tilting the camera causes convergence of upright lines.</i>
